The respect of those who knew Elmer Clausen can best be measured by the large turnout of VFW members providing the honor guard and rifle squad at his memorial service Thursday, July 18. Fifteen VFW members—four of them charter members of Post 5040 where Elmer was also a charter member—paid final respects to this World War II glider veteran.

At the close of the ceremony, Henry Nulle and Bill Lyford presented an American flag to Mary Clausen, Elmer's wife of over 40 years. Many VFW and Auxiliary members joined members of St. Ann Episcopal Church and Mary and Elmer's many friends at the church.

The fifteen men in the honor guard and firing squad were Joe Thiede, firing squad commander; Bill Lyford, honor guard commander; Bob Gibson, Dick Glawe, Harold Irwin, Charles Mathey, Jack Meyers, Henry Nulle, Bud Pflug, Art Schuld, Bruce Shisler, Art Slack, Don Sword, Gene Fuller and Jon Showers. Bob Schroeder, long-time bugler at local Memorial Day and Veteran's Day services, sounded "Taps."

I will remember Elmer Clausen as a tall, gentle man, somewhat reserved but a man with a good heart. It was Elmer, a bachelor, who found his love life with Mary Welke, whose husband Ernest died in 1955. The love led to marriage on January 2, 1960, and Elmer quickly became a father because Mary had two sons, Ernest Jr. and Ron.


I will also remember Elmer for his leadership ability in becoming the first commander of the VFW rifle squad, and for his energy in organizing the VFW ladies drill team. The rifle squad was organized soon after the Woodstock VFW was chartered March 4, 1946. Clausen soon thereafter trained the ladies drill team. The 35-member unit participated in many Harvard Milk Days and V-J Day parades.

In talking with Elmer in 1996, he told me the importance of the rifle squad. "This was after World War II and we provided a patriotic atmosphere for funerals conducted with a military ceremony. I remember how the rifle squad and honor guard lined the sidewalk when the casket came out of the church. Then we would hurry to the cemetery to provide a military setting and fire a salute to honor our departed comrade. In those years after World War II men took off from work to serve at funerals."

A memorial service was held at 11 a.m. Thursday, July 18 at St. Ann's Episcopal Church, Woodstock, with the Rev. Linda Green, interim rector, officiating. Internment was in the columbarium garden at St. Ann's Church. The VFW rifle squad commanded by Joe Thiede participated in the memorial at the church.

- Provided several articles for the Woodstock VFW News.
- Developed an expanded sponsor program for the Post paper and Vernon McCall ran it.
- Changed some of the work assignments for the Canteen/Bar with the help of Sue, Ralph and Pat, Vern and Bob B.
- Developed spreadsheets to help with payroll and other reports.

- Built a ramp for better access to the first floor with the help of a few others.
- Added the names of the LIFE members from Post 6004 to the LIFE board at Post 5040 with the help of Bill Lyford.
- Developed and implemented the \$50 LIFE program for our post; we now have more LIFE members at 5040 than the total population of the 2nd largest post in District Five.
- Opened another Sam's Club line of credit.
- Found a way to save about \$2,000 on the towel service.
- Lowered the insurance by \$3,000 with a new broker and then adjusted for better coverage.
- Recruited new member, Mike Iwaniky, into our post who is now helping Ralph with the QM work.
- Encouraged Matt to be the second Post News Editor.
- Prepared transition information packets for the four new check signers who were able to start signing checks on June 23rd.
- Led the VOD program. Our post had five schools participate out of eight schools. We had the 1st and 3rd place winners at the District out of the 3 winners.

Ralph and Pat were able to catch up on the filing in the QM office. **THANK YOU**. On June 22nd all the bills due up to that time were paid.

Gary has done a lot for the post as many have. I know he has made personal sacrifices for the time he has given to the post, and the post is better off for what he has done. Gary, on behalf of the post we thank you for your contributions. Your time and effort is much appreciated.

Are You Unable to Read *VFW NEWS...*or Just Not Interested?




