

Veterans Day – November 11th at Post 5040 By DON PEASLEY

A slight breeze blew the American flag gently as 200 citizens gathered outside the Woodstock VFW for Woodstock's annual Veterans Day program on Monday, November 11. Veterans—almost all of them veterans of World War II—provided the color guard and rifle squad for this traditional ceremony.

Grace Moline, curator at the McHenry County Historical Society discussed the McHenry County Historical Society's current exhibit, "Marching Off—Left Behind: The WWII Experience." Moline, featured speaker at the program, thanked the veterans for their help in compiling interviews, artifacts and photos for the award-winning exhibit, and announced she is planning her new exhibit around World War I and Korean War veterans.

"With over 1,100 World War II veterans dying each day, we don't know how much time we will have to show our gratitude to those who made sacrifices for our country.

"Take time now and every day to thank those veterans, and all the men and women who lived through those times, as they were all pulling together so we might enjoy the freedom we have today."

Bill Lyford, Past Commander of VFW Post 5040, was general chairman and the program's master of ceremonies. Marvin Bohnhoff, VFW chaplain, gave the opening and closing prayers.

Members of the rifle squad under the command of Ron Nehls included Harold Irwin, Dick Glawe, Art Slack, Art Schuld, Bud Pflug, Bruce Shisler and Chuck Mathey.

The color guard included Henry Nulle, Alan Belcher, Jon Showers and Bob Gibson under the command of Joe Thiede. Don Rhode, Crystal Lake veteran, was bugler for the Woodstock ceremony.

Nearly 200 people attended the traditional turkey dinner following the ceremony. The audience included many long-time veterans and their families, further united through having lived through wartime experiences impacting everyone.

Annual AuxiliaryTeachers Tea Held at VFW Post

Judith Sowinski, head of the English Department at Marian Central Catholic High School, was named "Teacher of the Year" Thursday, November 21 at the Woodstock VFW's Auxiliary annual Teachers Tea.

Nyda Fogarty and Chris Gehrke, co-chairmen, have conducted this annual tribute to teachers for many years.

Accepting the award, Sowinski said she feels honored to be on the list with distinguished teachers who have influenced the lives of students. "Teaching is a calling we love. It is a profession I have pursued from my earliest memory. Our students bring a fresh life to us," Sowinski said. Sowinski has taught 27 of her 33 years at Marian Central.

In nominating Sowinski for the recognition, Charles Rakers, principal said, "Mrs. Sowinski's enthusiasm and caring for her students is exemplary. She leads by example and is a positive role model for our staff and students. She goes the extra mile to help both her students and the English Department excel." Rakers said Sowinski encourages teachers in her department to focus on grammar and usage skills, as well as on comprehension and analytical skills. "Our students' scores on the ACT have risen steadily since Mrs. Sowinski instituted this department-wide focus," said Rakers.

The VFW Auxiliary originated a Teacher of the Year recognition in 1957 and has helped called attention to the important role teachers have in the lives of our young people. This was the 47th annual Teachers Tea. No Teas were held in 1994 or 1995.

Four previous Teacher of the Year recipients attended the Tea, which featured the Woodstock High School Madrigals singing some of their Christmas program songs. The four were: Mary Ellen Howard, 1982; Darlene Gorski, 1986; Deanna Liles, 2000; and Shirley Thomas, 2001.

The Woodstock High School Madrigals, directed by Paul Rausch, provided the entertainment. Rausch announced the Madrigal Dinner dates are Friday, December 13 and Saturday, December 14. Call the high school for tickets 338-4370.


Still Looking for that Last Minute Christmas Gift or Hard to Shop for Relative?


