The Woodstock VFW and the Woodstock VFW Auxiliary continued a tradition started in 1956 in naming two veteran teachers to receive the accolade, "Teacher of the Year," at the annual Teachers Tea Thursday, November 20.

Vincent Malek, Marian Central Catholic High School chemistry teacher, and Chris Strong, Woodstock High School (WHS) English teacher, were named winners. Chairman Nyda Fogarty explained, "We had so many excellent nominees we decided to recognize the accomplishments of two teachers this year."

Fogarty said the VFW and its Auxiliary want to focus attention on the importance of teachers shaping the lives of so many children in this profession.

"We are the only Woodstock organization besides the District 200 school board with a formal program honoring teachers," Fogarty added.

incorporated literature, radio, television and filmmaking and operation of the school's FM station (89.1) as part of his instruction.

"Strong's passion for teaching English is reflected in the outstanding programs he has developed over the years," said Dean Schultz, WSH principal. "His personal and professional qualities enable him to lead the staff and students in a favorable environment of technology and music in the English curriculum."

Strong began his teaching career at Abingdon High School in 1966 following his graduation from Western Illinois University. He came to WHS in 1969. Reflecting on his extensive career Strong said one difference today from his first years as a teacher is the diversity among students ethnically and economically.

"Vincent Malek is an outstanding educator. His enthusiasm about science has infected his students with a joy of learning," said Charles Rakers, Marian principal.

Malek was winner of the 2001 Davis Award, an award given to one Illinois teacher each year by the Chemical Industry Council of Illinois for excellence in teaching chemistry.

Malek and his wife Victoria have two sons and a daughter. Richard is in production with a radio station in Denver. Darren is in custodial work in Woodstock. Lauren is married to Dr. Mark Hanson and lives in Bloomington.


Woodstock Mayor Alan Cornue joins American Legion members at the unveiling of a Woodstock American Legion plaque in the Square honoring all veterans.


