A Little Background on Our Leadership

Two Vietnam War veterans and a World War II Army veteran will lead the Woodstock VFW Post 5040 during 2004-2005. Officers were elected in April and will assume duties officially July 1.

Sid Sherwin was re-elected Commander. Bill Lyford, who has served three previous times as Commander, will serve as Senior Vice Commander. Hank Enstrom will be the Junior Vice Commander.

Sherwin, 56, was drafted in the Navy in 1967. He served aboard the USS Coral Sea as a navigator and helmsmen. He started his painting and decorating business after being discharged in 1970 and joined the VFW in 1971. He became an active member at the urging of Gene Fuller in 1998.

Sherwin served a year as Junior Vice Commander. A year ago he was elected Senior Vice Commander, then assumed the Commander's position in late 2003 following Commander Jon Showers' resignation. Sid and his wife, Ann, live in Woodstock.

Lyford, 80, grew up in Chicago and was drafted in 1943. After basic training he was shipped to Casablanca late that year and fought his way through Iran, Tunis and then sailed to Naples where his infantry unit went to Anzio and established a beachhead in January 1944.

Lyford's infantry unit continued fighting their way into France, then into Germany and were in the Battle of the Bulge in southern Germany. Bill was discharged December 3, 1945 and completed a tool and dye apprenticeship. He left that trade after three years because of an injury.

He then worked as a carpenter in the Chicago area. He is a charter member of the VFW in River Grove. Bill and his wife Eileen have lived in Hidden Lake Estates following his retirement since 1989.

Lyford became active in VFW affairs, worked his way through the offices and was elected Commander in 2000 and re-elected in 2001.

Enstrom, 58, native of Wonder Lake, was in military service from 1966 to 1969. He was in Vietnam from October 1966 to October 1967. He was assigned to a helicopter battalion.

He works with Illinois Tools Works in sales. The company manufactures electrical and electronic connectors.

He joined the VFW while in Chicago and is a life member. He served Post 5040 as Judge Advocate last year.

Hank and Irene have three grown children, one grandchild and another on the way.

Congratulations to our 2004 Poppy Day workers! You raised \$3,880 for selling Poppies. Thanks to all who participated in this event.




