# Craver Receives Don Peasley Award

The New Horizon Veterans Center at Hebron joined in saluting men and women in service with a patriotic celebration Sunday, June 27. Alan Belcher, president of the board which established New Horizon, took the occasion to present an award to Kevin Craver, a man who is a member of the Illinois Army National Guard.

Craver, Northwest Herald reporter, was scheduled to receive the award named the Don Peasley Award, at the Circle of Life celebration but two days before the event he was called for a short period of active duty for advanced training. His infantry regiment unit may be called to support units headed to Iraq, Craver said.

Accepting the award for Craver, Kurt Begalka, Northwest Herald journalism said, "As a friend and co-worker at the Northwest Herald I've gotten to know Kevin quite well. If I were in a foxhole, I'd want him watching my back. He is an incredibly hard worker. He is skilled at his craft and tenacious at unearthing the truth, yet, he easily disarms people with his wacky sense of humor."

Begalka said, "He told me recently, 'I'm the only reporter in the newsroom who knows how to lay a landmine."

"Staff Sergeant Craver could be headed for Iraq, but he takes it all in stride," said Begalka.

Craver told Begalka, he felt "weird" about getting the award. "He prefers to remain below the radar in the trenches with his men. He believes there are others more deserving.

The VFW News over the years has received 15 National Publication Awards. For different years, it has also received awards for first, second, and third place at the State level.

"Accomplishing what Don Peasley had with the VFW News is a hard act to follow," cited Matt.

"Don is a journalist and has many years under his belt as a writer. Unfortunately, I don't have that type of experience. However, with the help of the post, I still think we can come out on top one of these years," Matt acknowledged to post members when asked why he didn't get first place. "Let's see about next year."

As Editor, Matt has kept the masthead of the VFW News, carried over from when Don was Editor.

"I think its important to preserve what he started. Even though I am the Editor now, he's still a large part of the paper and I want to provide the same purpose to post members as he started out doing, providing a method of keeping members informed of VFW and Auxiliary activities and to let members know how they can help veterans in need, communicate social activities, and VFW community involvement."

One of the new methods of communication that Matt has introduced was the creation of the VFW Post 5040 website (www.vfw5040.org) in March of 2003.

"Its just another means of communicating what our post

is about, not just locally, but anyone around the world can find out what our Post is like from the web pages, pictures, news letters, etc.," Matt said of the website.

The website features web pages on Post History, Post and Auxiliary officers, Calendar of Events, current and back issues of the VFW News (last 12 issues), pictures of the post, and even a message board to post comments on.

Matt commented on his thoughts about the post having a web presence, "Today, no matter what your institution is (business, religious, educational, military), public or private, large or small, for-profit or non-profit, you have to have a web site. Its your stake in cyberspace that says 'Here we are! This is what we're about.' There are about 396 VFW Posts in Illinois alone, of those only 31 have websites listed on the National VFW webpage. That's only 8% of Illinois VFW Posts. If you want to find out about other posts, the internet is the next best thing than actually driving to the post to attend a meeting. You don't even have to leave home for that."

"It's still a learning experience. I think (and hope) that with each news letter that I create that I am getting better. Its hard to come by new stories about the post sometimes. I still have a lot to learn about journalism. I've seen other Post'snews letters, borrowed some ideas, and take suggestions as they come."

Matt also stressed that if post members have committee reports of something they did, stories involving the VFW, or suggestions, please send them to the post or Editor (address on the back of this newsletter).

That attitude is what makes him a great choice for this honor," Begalka continued.

Presenting the award, Belcher said, "Kevin has been an active supporter of veterans and the veterans here at New Horizon. He has gone out of his way to make sure the active soldier and veterans are represented in the newspaper."

"He serves with the U.S. Army National Guard. Craver joined the National Guard 13 years ago. In 2002 he was called up and served seven months in Germany. Kevin is just the sort of reason New Horizon wants to recognize him with the Don Peasley Award.

Belcher said the award was named after Peasley in recognition of his 57 years of community involvement which includes extensive recognition of veterans' participation in our local communities.

Belcher added, "The Don Peasley Award reflects an individual who is very much a part of the roots of McHenry County. His involvement, commitment and what he's achieved in capturing the Woodstock community is huge. This award symbolizes greatness."

The June 27 event was held at the New Horizon facilities on Route 47 north of Hebron. The former Hi-Di-Ho Motel has facilities to house 14 veterans.

Said Belcher, "We give guys who are homeless a second chance at living."

The day-long activity included music, messages and 150 vendors selling everything from military memorabilia to antiques, from pets to baked dog cookies. The program included a parade from downtown Hebron with 89 motorcyclists joining in the festivities.

### Helping Our Soldiers of Today

I have a son who is a US Marine that returned safely from his nine-month tour in Iraq. As you know we have many Service Men and Women who have not been as lucky as my son. Liz Kehrer is a proud wife of an Air Force Vietnam Vet who served as a medic with a Marine division.

Liz and I know we all are grateful Americans that understand that our freedom is a gift from the veterans of the past, present and future. It is not you and I who has made the sacrifice to keep this country free it is the Service Men and Women that have paid the price for our freedom. Our wounded Service Men and Women need to know that we care about them and their families. Most Americans haven't seen the growing numbers of wounded troops returning from war who are cared for at military facilities sealed off from the public. Little attention has been paid to the long, difficult and very personal struggles they will endure for the rest of their lives. Our wounded soldiers need to know that we have not forgotten them.

When we started this fundraiser back in November we had 2,000 wounded. We now have 5,112 wounded soldiers and over a thousand of them have lost limbs (some of them more then one) hundreds have brain damage, badly burned, blind and/or deaf for life. We have sent over a 1,000 male and female care packages to our Heroic Soldiers that are hospitalized at Walter Reed Hospital in Washington DC, Brookes Medical Center and to the US Medical units in Iraq and Germany. These young men and women are truly the Heart of America.

The Wounded Soldiers project seeks to assist those men and women of our armed forces who have been severely injured during the conflicts in Iraq, Afghanistan, and other hot spots around the world. Many of the injuries are traumatic amputations, gunshot wounds, burns and blast injuries that will retire these brave warriors from military service. Many wounded soldiers are evacuated straight out of the field with no possessions. Each Care Package will cost, without donations from merchant's, approximately. \$45.00. You may send a care package in your name to a wounded soldier for a \$45.00 donation. Please make checks payable to Veterans Foundation of Illinois/Wounded Soldiers. (This foundation is a 501c(3) organization, your do-

nation is taxdeductible).


