Buddy Poppy Days in May

The VFW has made that trademark a guarantee that all poppies bearing that name and the VFW label are genuine products of the work of disabled and needy veterans.

This year's guest speaker will be Principal Ed O'Brien of Woodstock's St. Mary School. The co-parade marshals for the parade will be brothers Chuck and Jim Gehrke, both Vietnam veterans as well as past post commanders of Woodstock VFW Post 5040.

While on vacation in Florida, we went to the Warbird air show in Titusville, Florida where restored military aircraft were on display. The show displayed dog-fights, strafing, bombing, skydiving, and many military jets from World War I through Desert Storm.

At the air show, I met retired General Paul Tibbets. Paul was the son of father Paul Warfield and Enola Gay Tibbets, of whom the famous airplane is named after that dropped the first atomic bomb during World War II. Paul Tibbets' plane dropped the 12 foot x 28 inch, 9,000 pound bomb named "Little Boy" on Hiroshima at 8:15 am Hiroshima time on August 6, 1945.

I shook his hand and thanked him for saving my life by dropping the A-Bomb which prevented the invasion of Japan. His reply was "I'm sorry I interrupted your trip." I also got a good picture of him signing autographs. He is 90 years old, born February 23, 1915.

Remembering Past Commander Ken Kerns

Ken Kerns, 80, who died April 14, served aboard a patrol craft in the Pacific Theater from 1942 to 1946 in the U.S. Navy. Soon after returning to Woodstock, he became interested in the VFW and devoted many years of service to

veterans.

He worked his way through the chairs to become Commander in 1960 at age 35. Dean Mishler was Senior Vice Commander and Ervin Burg was Junior Vice Commander. When the *VFW News* started in 1955 Ken helped by selling advertising.

I became acquainted with Ken immediately after coming to Woodstock because he was working as a printer with the *Woodstock Journal*. He published the *Journal* twice a week and the *Hebron Times* and the *Huntley Review* each once a week. So Ken and the staff were quite busy with newspapers and job printing.

When the Journal was sold January 26, 1950 to the B.F. Shaw Company, Ken worked for several yeas at the *Woodstock Sentinel* office on South Jefferson Street. He enjoyed the printing business and later established his own business. As a result, he produced and printed several publications related to his military career. One of his books was a collection of articles and photos from the *VFW News* relating to his participation in the activities of Post 5040.

He was one of the four leaders in conducting the successful V-J Day Parade and Pageant of Drums. He teamed with Maynard Wilkerson, Bob Behler and Roy Stackhouse to present Woodstock's single greatest weekend community attraction from 1955 through 1974.

Ken was active in the Elks Lodge and served as chaplain for a year. After moving to the Union area he was elected to the Union Village board in June 1988, a position he held for six and one half years.

He enjoyed the graphic arts field as a life-long hobby, but another of his passions was to collect and restore antique autos.

On October 20, 1946 he married Cora Paxton. She died in July 1975. On August 28, 1976 he married Arlene Ehle, who survives. He is also survived by a daughter, Pamela Mugger; two sisters, Marilyn Phalin of McHenry, and Janice Schwebke, McHenry; and several other close relatives.

I enjoyed Ken's wry sense of humor and his spirit of hard work at the *Journal* at a time when the organization struggled

to overcome obsolete equipment and a shortage of advertising but had a strong community spirit. This community spirit of service inspired members of the entire *Woodstock Journal* staff.

Speaking of going into the new year got me thinking. I've seen other post's news letters do this and also the Woodstock Elks' news letters. Each month one or more of the officers write a small column for their news letter. Wouldn't it be refreshing to read about what's on the officers minds, find out about their agenda's and ideas for the post? Much of what you read today in this news letter is based upon each months meeting. I cut out the details of business, but many of the columns that I write about are events that post is planning to do and are discussed in each monthly meeting. They let you, our membership, know what's going on. For some of you this is the only form of contact you have with the post. A column or two from other members of the post I think would be welcome change of pace.

I wish there were more of you at last month's meeting. We had some heated discussion and debates about one of the thorns that stick in the side of any non-profit organization: finances. If you look back over the many years that the post has been operating, you have seen many changes financially.

Over the last few years, we have had to take measures to curb costs in order to keep the post running. Take for instance Bingo. It was a losing endeavor for us and we had to shut that down. At the last meeting, for the previous quarter, we had \$8,000 in lost revenue. We have a committee that is looking into the club finances (this includes bar, kitchen, dinners, hall rentals) to see where the problems are. Based on their findings I think that there will be some additional changes. Our Wednesday night dinners are losing money and the bar operates at a loss as well.

Since the last meeting, I have been asking myself "What over the last 50 years has changed the post from being a vibrant community hub to virtually staying alive today?" The only answer I have is change. The community has changed. People have so many options today. Look how many new restaurants are in the surrounding communities that people can choose from to get a great meal compared to our Post. Competition is stiff.

Change has affected membership. The VFW is not the "place to be" as it was in the 1950's and 60's when the post was young. It doesn't entice as it did. If you look back at some of the old *VFW News* letters, you can see how much the Post was involved in. Today we cannot even come close to that. With our limited and aging active members, each year it gets harder to say to the younger potential members "this is the place you want to be a part of."

A new VFW year means new officers. I have a feeling the post is in for some major changes this year. As always, I will do my best to keep you informed. - *Matt*
