



A highlight was a vote to build a memorial building in Washington D.C for about \$1,000,000 or 25 cents per member for four years. Red Cross president received a \$10,000 check from the VFW for flood relief.
- Membership Kickoff Dinner is scheduled for October 8.
- V-J Day Celebration drew 10,000 people to Woodstock.
- 22 Photos from the V-J festivities (primarily this issue was a pictorial of the V-J Celebration).

- Leonie Kennedy, Auxiliary President, gives report that Lorraine Holm is the delegate to the National Auxiliary encampment at the convention. Auxiliary overall has about 37,000 total members. National women's president Agnes Holz presented General Christenberry with at \$13,000 check to be used for the Korean people.

Entry Deadline November 1, 2005

The Voice of Democracy, endorsed by the National Association of Secondary School Principals' contest criteria, is an audio essay contest for high school students in grades 9-12. The annual contest, which is designed to foster patriotism, allows students the opportunity to voice their opinion in a three to five minute essay based on an annual theme.

Created in 1947, the scholarship program annually provides more than \$3 million in scholarships. Each Department's first-place winner receives an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C., plus the opportunity to compete for national scholarships. The first-place national winner receives a \$25,000 scholarship.





