

With the 50th Anniversary of the VFW News honored in the July 2005 issue, each month until July 2006, a column will be featured looking back 50 years to the current month. In the January 1956 issue of the VFW News:

- Commander Earl Holm mentions that Post now has a doorman for Saturday nights, admitting only members and guests.
- Post will turn 10 years old in March of 1956. Suggestions sought for awards, speakers, and dinner.
- Bill Thomson, World War I veteran and employee at Woodstock Typewriter and R. C. Allen is interviewed. Thomson was born in Dundee, Scotland in 1888 and came to the U.S. in 1890. In 1906 he enlisted in the National Guard. He was commissioned a First Lieutenant in 1912. He went

overseas on May 2, 1918 with the 33rd Division. He saw action July 4, 1919 in Belgium and fought into then occupied Luxemburg. He returned in 1919 after taking part in four major battles. According to the interview, Thomson planted the idea for forming a VFW post in Woodstock in the minds of several WW II veterans.

- VFW league bowling is the hot topic once again at Edgetown Alleys.
- The fifth district is holding a bowling tourney, open only to VFW members and will be held at Champaign-Urbana.
- New Year's Eve is rung in by VFW members packing the post to dance and celebrate the wonderful new year of 1956.
- Auxiliary Leonie Kennedy mentions about sponsoring a Brownie Troop at Clay street school. Youth program will be extended.

VFW Post members and Ladies Auxiliary members, this applies to you. On the VFW website we have each of the officers names listed. I have seen on other VFW websites that if a website visitor clicks on an officer's name, if the computer they are using has an e-mail program on it, the email program will open up and a new letter to the officer can be composed and then sent directly to that officer. I can set up any one of you with an email address in the format: first_name.last_name@vfw5040.org As long as you have some other email address you regularly check mail with, I can forward any email that is sent to the first_name.last_name@vfw5040.org address to your regularly checked email account. This is confidential and I never see the actual email. This is a feature of our web site hosting company in that I can create an unlimited aliases and forward to your regularly checked email. I can do this for any member if you wish to have your own VFW 5040 email address. Just send me an email with the email address you want mail forwarded to and I will set it up for you. I can stop this at any time if you don't want the VFW 5040 email address. Let me know. Contact me at: matt.klos@vfw5040.org Note: you won't be able to send anyone email using the first_name.last_name@vfw5040.org address. The web hosting package we have only allows me to set up 10 of these accounts and you have to configure your email program to use a POP3/SMTP account in order to do this. There are only 9 of these accounts left. If you would like one of these types of accounts and know how to set it up, let me know.


