Buddy Poppy Days May 12 & 13

It's that time of year again when you begin to see the bright red and black poppy on lapels and hats which only means one thing - veterans groups selling poppies. As in the past, VFW Post 5040 will be selling Buddy Poppies around Woodstock on May 12 and 13, the same weekend as the Soup to Nuts sale.

Junior Vice Commander, Jim Clegg. who is chairman of this event, has put a signup sheet at the VFW bar for people to sign their names to, indicating times and pre-selected location selling points.

The funds generated all go our Veteran's Relief Fund which is strictly used to help veterans. These funds cannot be used for other purposes.

In February 1924, the VFW registered the name "Buddy Poppy" with the U.S. Patent Office. A certificate was issued on May 20, 1924, granting the VFW all trademark rights in the name of Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers. The VFW has made that trademark a guarantee that all poppies bearing that name and the VFW label are genuine products of the work of disabled and needy veterans.

For every poppy that is bought through the National VFW to be used by Posts during Poppy Days, a special tax is levied. (1½¢) goes to the Veterans Service Fund of the Department having jurisdiction; (1¢) to the Veterans Service Fund of the National Headquarter; (1¢) to the VFW National Home Fund for Children.

Many people associate Poppy Days with the famous poem, "In Flanders Fields" which is about World War I. It was written by Canadian physician John McCrae on May 3, 1915. The poppies referred to in the poem grew in abundance in Flanders fields where war casualties had been buried. Today, Poppies are distributed by veterans groups as a memorial flower.

In Flanders Fields

In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly, Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved, and were loved, and now we lie, In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high. If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders fields.

Loyalty Day Monday, May 1

VFW Post to commemorate day with a dinner on May 7 at 1:00 pm

Although Loyalty Day is observed on May 1 in the United States, the Post will be remembering this day with a spaghetti lunch/dinner on May 7. Veterans, teachers and children will be \$5.00, everyone else will be \$6.00. Spaghetti, sauce, bread and a salad will be served.

Loyalty Day is a day set aside for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States and for the recognition of the heritage of American freedom.

The holiday was first celebrated in the 1930s as Americanization Day, and was intended to serve as a counterweight to May Day, which was celebrated as a Communist holiday.

Loyalty Day is celebrated with parades and ceremonies in communities across the United States, although many people in the United States remain unaware of it. Although a legal holiday, it is not a federal holiday.

The President is requested to issue a proclamation calling on United States Government officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on Loyalty Day; and inviting the people of the United States to observe Loyalty Day with appropriate ceremonies in schools and other suitable places.


