

Reflections on VFW Post 5040 and its past 62 years of history By Don Peasley

VFW News Editor 1955-2002

Throughout more than six decades VFW and Auxiliary members have built on four pillars:

- 1. Service to veterans.
- 2. Service to youths and families
- 3. Service to community
- 4. Patriotism

As this nation undergoes tremendous turbulence and turmoil - our men and women risk and lose lives in far-flung battlefields - patriotism is an ongoing emotional experience.

VFW and Auxiliary members exemplify this fourth pillar in many ways: Donating flags to schools, civic groups and local organizations; sponsoring the Voice of Democracy contest; conducting programs at schools to help students learn what patriotism means and how good citizens respect this country's heritage; supporting the National Guard; and conducting Memorial Day and Veterans Day observances each year.

Readers of the Woodstock VFW *News* know how Post 5040 members build on these four pillars because you are the ones who bring about these accomplishments.

It's satisfying for me to refresh my memory of how our VFW began. Just who broached the idea of a VFW Post is uncertain as the 10-year history in the March 1956 *VFW News* indicates.

At any rate, members met November 15, 1945 to organize and elect officers. Charter Night was March 4, 1946 and Frank Kennedy, World War II Air Force pilot (and brother of Pat Gaylord and Jane Dahm) was elected first Commander.

Post 5040 had 224 charter members. Members formed an Auxiliary November 18, 1946. The support of Auxiliary members is one of the bright stars in VFW's service to the Woodstock community and veterans.

In October 1947 VFW began one of its noteworthy service to veterans, the monthly visit with hospitalized veterans at Downey Hospital. This commitment continued to just a few years ago as it became difficult for veterans to make that ride to North Chicago.

Woodstock was experiencing a housing shortage after World War II, and Don Wilkerson led the VFW in rousing the Woodstock community to provide more housing for returning veterans and their families. Wilkerson took the lead in form-

#### ing a Veterans Housing Council. This council caused action by city council members. Though no mass housing program took place, it encouraged independent contractors to built low-cost housing.

One of the most successful VFW projects was sponsoring a Teen-er League team in the National VFW program. This team for 13-15-year-olds won the state title in 1967. In the National playoffs it lost to the eventual champions (West Allis, Wisconsin) during the three-game playoff at Elgin. The VFW is also a leader of the Woodstock Little League, a position it has maintained since the league was started in 1954.

Another memorable early VFW activity was to organize a Fourth of July Festival with rides, entertainment, food and fireworks at the city park.

Another early activity was searching for a permanent home. Members purchased

It was reported by our Treasurer that only a few have paid their dues for this next year which started the new year on July 1st.




## Additional names of fallen soldiers

Patriot's Pen, a youth-essay writing contest endorsed by the National Association of Secondary School Principals' contest criteria, is a nationwide competition that gives students in grades 6, 7 and 8 the opportunity to write essays expressing their views on democracy. Annually, more than 115,000 students participate in the annual contest.

Contestants write a 300-400 word essay based on an annual patriotic theme. The first-place winner receives a \$10,000 savings bond and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington D.C. The top national winners each receive a savings bond anywhere from \$1,000 to \$10,000.

## Blood drive sponsored by Woodstock Moose and VFW 5040 earns praise from Heartland **Blood Center**

[Editor's Note: Once in a while a note comes to the VFW that needs to be shared with our members. This is one of those notes on a recent blood drive. Nice work, guys!]

I can't thank you enough for the outstanding job the two of you did on your blood drive! This first-time drive, cosponsored by the Moose Lodge 1329 and VFW Post 5040 was a great success! The last drive held at the Moose was in November of 2004 where 15 units were collected on an 8 hour drive.

Although my initial hope for this drive was to collect 25 units, you both talked me into raising the goal to 31 to get an additional three beds. I nervously agreed. Well, you surpassed that goal handily bringing in

40 units! Four of those units were given by two, much-appreciated double red cell donors, one of which was you Ralph Ritter. There were 10 people deferred for various reasons.

Having your blood drive on a Sunday morning in coordination with one of your breakfasts was very beneficial as it brought in a considerable number of walkin donors. Although we always prefer to have people schedule appointments to keep the waiting times to a minimum, walk-in's are always welcome.

John, thanks so much to you for encouraging sign-ups, making all of the arrangements and allowing us to use your facility. Ralph, without your recruitment efforts, putting up the posters and personally reaching out to people, we would not have seen the great turnout that we enjoyed (I also noticed, by the way, a whole lot of Ritters' donated blood at your drive.).


Thanks to the generosity of the two of you and all of your donors. You have helped us keep the inventory levels stable in McHenry County. Many are not aware that Heartland Blood Centers is the sole

supplier of your local hospitals, including Centegra Woodstock and McHenry. We of course must have the blood on hand before it is needed. In order to meet the needs of the 33 hospitals we supply in Illinois and Indiana, as an organization we must collect approximately 600 units daily. This is one of the reasons you might notice the number of blood drives going on regularly in the community. Since blood components have a shelf life, we must collect them often and on a regular basis. People are eligible to safely donate whole blood every 56 days or 8 weeks. Donors must weigh a minimum of 110 lbs. and be at least 16 years of age (with parent's permission).

I look forward to working with you again soon!

the Austin property at 240 Throop Street on December 16, 1946. An addition was constructed by members in time to install Joe Thiede as Commander in May 1954.

One other major activity took place in the 1950s when Earl Holm was Commander. When I approached him for the Post to publish a Post publication, the Woodstock VFW News resulted and has continued since, thanks to the support of the membership.

The significance of the VFW News to me is that it provides a dependable way to keep members informed of services, ways the VFW helps the community and an opportunity to reach out to members for help on specific activities.

Since I retired as editor in 2002, Matt Klos has done a superb job in keeping members informed of VFW activities on those four pillars. Matt did an especially notable job in going through the VFW *News* through the years and compiling the 60th anniversary edition in April 2006.

Reflecting on the history of the VFW in Woodstock, I find the V-J Day Parade and Pageant of Drums a memorable achievement. This was a community-wide event conducted by the VFW, 1955 through 1974. It received high praise from the National VFW which called it "the most outstanding activity sponsored by a VFW Post in the nation."

The decision to honor all teachers in our community with an annual Teachers Tea began in 1956 and continued until just a few years ago. Who has more influence on our children than our teachers? The parents? Maybe. But the vast majority in the teaching profession are sincere, dedicated

Through the years VFW in an unheralded way serves veterans and their families in need. We have the VFW service officer with the responsibility of keeping on top when "a call to action" comes to the attention of those at the VFW building or officers of our Post.

VFW members are dedicated to honor veterans and do it with such activities as the annual Memorial Day and Veterans Day programs. However, they do it in another significant way. From the first vear with Elmer Claussen as the first Honor Guard Commander, the VFW has had an Honor Guard - a Rifle Squad - participate in veterans funerals and pay last respects with three volleys at the gravesite.

The VFW is not all work and no play. There is a recreational aspect. This was especially true in the first decades. Members had growing families and funds were limited, but there was an opportunity for dinners and dances at the VFW (also at the Woodstock Armory in those first years). Who among old-timers can forget those costumed Halloween parties? You were always surprised to learn who was behind the mask after prize winners were announced!

In recent years members have kept up the ability to help members in need. They have provided tributes to our deceased comrades as we continue to see the death of many World War II veterans. The VFW continues to support the essay contest for students, sells Buddy Poppies to help raise money for hospitalized veterans at North Chicago.

Most recently, the VFW sent care packages to troops on active duty overseas. Members are also prominent participants in activities bidding farewell to our National Guard members leaving for active duty. The VFW also participates in "Welcome Home" ceremonies in the Woodstock Square.

Those interested in the history of the Woodstock VFW and Auxiliary-and indeed in the activities and history of the Woodstock community-are fortunate to have the Woodstock VFW News as an ongoing responsible resource. This history reflects the people of the community and changes in Woodstock over 62 years.

It reflects the growth of the community and a changing in the business climate. However, it also reflects the continuation of the responsibility to serve youths, help veterans and keep in the forefront of serving the 24,600 people of Woodstock.


