VA Mortgage Corner

find an envelope, get a stamp, fill out the survey and send it back. It takes time to do and some people just don't want to respond.

However, some of you actually took the time to fill out the survey and send it back to me. Thanks to all those that did.

I am including the results of the survey as well as many of the comments I received, identifying information removed. You might find some interesting responses from your fellow VFW and Auxiliary members and with even a few trips down memory lane. I respect each of the comments and our membership should too. This is just a small sampling from our membership and does not reflect the opinions of everyone.

So, here are the responses that I received. There were a total of 19 responses returned. Out of our readership list, this was 3.5%. In the questions below, n/a is for "not answered".

Question 1: Overall, are you satisfied with what our VFW Post has been doing in the last year or two with regard to fundraising, community involvement, etc.?

Yes: 73.7% No: 10.5% n/a: 15.8%

Comments:

- We have to do MORE!
- Charging too much for tickets.
- For the few members involved, the community involvement has been great. However (an understatement), with more members being active, so much more could be done, especially in the area of sending packages to the military people in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Question 2: If you are not an active member that regularly attends VFW meetings, are you concerned with what may happen with the Post home building?

Yes: 89.5% No: 0.0% n/a: 10.5%

Comments:

- I am not an active member and the miles keep me from being so. Even though I will most likely not be moving back to Woodstock any time in the near future, I care a great deal about the VFW home. I made a short visit back to Woodstock in June and it was wonderful to take my family and point out Mom and Dad's photo's, mine also. It is very nice to remember taken tap dance lessons as a child upstairs.
- I'm an active member (but not as much as I'd like), but I'm VERY much concerned about what may happen to the

Post building.

Question 3: Do you think it would be advantageous to sell the VFW and begin to donate the proceeds to community organizations over several years?

Yes: 15.8% No: 78.9% n/a: 5.3%

Comments:

- I really do not know. Are we able to pay the bills to keep it? Would 5040 go away if it was sold? Had you gotten an offer, what would happen to the photos and plaques? Would you need to buy another place to meet? If 5040 were to go away could I still transfer my life membership? I have not wanted to do that since I LOVE my newsletter. I do buy raffle tickets when I can. What other organizations and how would they be picked?
- Real Estate taxes are high. Rent a smaller place.
- I'm not involved enough in the "inner" workings of the Post to answer this question. I assume this question means selling the building. I cannot see any advantage to this idea, unless we would then be able to acquire a smaller, easier to maintain facility. Then the present state of the economy, would we have any money left to donate? I was also under the impression that the District acquires the property when we cease using it.

Question 4: Our Post is the fourth largest Post in our district of 25 Posts, making up 9% of the District Membership. Do you think our VFW Post should merge with another VFW Post? (Woodstock is the largest in McHenry County. Districtly speaking, Waukegan has 475, Winthrop Harbor 538, and Lake Villa at 656 according the VFW IL statistics.)

Yes: 26.3% No: 63.2% n/a: 10.5%

Comments:

- If it stays at our Woodstock Post.
- If we keep Post 5040 the actual Post.
- Where would the meetings move to? Would it make it harder on members to make it to the meeting? Okay, so the benefits from doing that might be that the we become a better VFW, I want more information about that now if we have to sell I can see this.
- But we should welcome any Post who wishes to merge with us as Post 6004 did.

Question 5: Is the VFW that you remember and were involved with at some point in your life the same VFW of today?

Yes: 15.8% No: 78.9% n/a: 5.3%

Comments:

- It was supported better then.
- Too few members attend VFW functions, meetings, dinners, bar, Monday coffee, blood drives, etc.
- Nothing stays the same, but yes it would be wonderful to come home and have the bar I sat with my parents with and drank Shirley Temples with still be there. I think that you still sell Poppy's and that you still do visits to the VA but I am not sure. Fish Fry's and Bingo. The things I loved.
- Poor support from membership.
- Each member does his own thing doesn't follow rules and regulations.
- The WWII vets who spearheaded those programs have passed on or become very old.
- The old guard is about gone. Too few vets join the VFW. New blood is needed to do what WWII vets can no longer do because of health, sickness or disabilities
- I remember VJ parades, Christmas kid parties.
- Except fewer are able or willing to help as volunteers.
- Different type of people.
- Because so many of the members that founded the Post and were very active, have died or can hardly function any more.

Question 6: Not so much as a question but asking for comments directed to your new Post 5040 Officers. There were quite a lot of them. What would you like to tell our new officers?

Comments:

- I don't see why the VFW has to donate to the City or schools, etc. We should use our money to take care of the Post. I live [out of state] and try to get to the Post when I am in Woodstock. I think it's a great Post.
- The fish fry attendance has gone way down. I quit coming to the fish fry because the fish was over cooked. It would end up on the floor when I tried to cut it.
- Find a Friday cook and improve the service for people eating. Rent the front office. Keep the picnic as long as John will have us. Great event. Try to increase membership. Please publish how many respond to this.
- I don't really know since I have not been active so many years. The one year I was an officer I knew that we needed to get more money. I think that we served lots of dinners. Renting the hall for parties is a good way to get funds. We have

- a wonderful space perfect for parties, dinners, and meetings. Maybe work on selling that. Then you need to have the workers for that. I remember when the Soup to Nuts sale was started. That works well from what I have read. I saw that you had a car show. That might be something else that you could work on expanding. I know the car shows I work here can be very good fundraisers. Get the word out about dinners and providing information booths any and everywhere you can. If you can sell beer outside the hall, having a beer booth at almost anything is a good way to raise money. Maybe the City Park on the 4th of July. If you can't sell beer, maybe soda's or water and include a flyer telling about hall rental with everything vou do. Wish I were there to help. If you sell beer at the 4th of July, I might come up to help with that.
- We need more fund raisers. Assess each member \$5.00 or more per month or maybe a Spirit Fund.
- We are spending too much of our time and money on the building instead of helping veterans.
- Why would you sell the building in this economy? You would not get anything in regards to value. You couldn't even rent anything because of cost. If they would have their meetings on meeting night and not hold them at the bar in their little cliques, it would flow smoother. They had better get their cook deal settled or they won't have anything to worry about.
- Suggest you ask the originals, Bob Shroeder, Dwayne Raney, etc. how they spurred the early VFW programs and lead a vital Woodstock VFW.
- I wish I could name the things to be done. But there needs to be a greater interest in the VFW. We need a campaign to get all newer vets, Korea, Vietnam, Bosnia, Iraq, Afghanistan. Right now, all officers must sit down and devise ways to raise more money to keep the VFW going. There are too few and too old members to do the needed work.
- Keep up the good work.
- I hope members, locally, come forward and help out. You have a good program. Selling the building, the house, will be the end of 5040. Like the Odd Fellows & Rebekahs, try and keep the building, I live [out of state] so don't get out much.
- It would be advantageous to form a partnership with the Elks, American Legion, VFW and any other organization to form a group adventure and meet

- at one location to reduce expenses.
- The best is the VFW News because it provides a live, vital link between members and the service activities of the Post.
- Fish frys are a mess with Bingo being played while you eat and the service is bad. Takes too long for your food. Bingo should be played upstairs. The new Chaplain isn't putting in who is sick or who is in the hospital. That could improve.
- I don't think by selling the current building would correct all the problems but it would be nice if something was obtainable that was on all on one floor, maybe smaller and newer, though moving out of town would not be feasible. I know the city wants the property but they don't want to give a fair price for it.
- The big problem is that the men that had so much dedication and ability to run the various functions are dying off as you can see as to the age of the Firing Squad and Honor Guards. There are a few left around in their 50's or 60's that do care about maintaining the VFW. The younger men are all so busy working and are spread between other activities that the responsibility of being at the VFW is not THERE. The older ones grew up in the fact that the VFW was THEIR Post and they did everything they could do to work at it, maintain it, and support it, even if they were involved with Little Leagues and city activities, through differences of opinion and compatibility with the other members. They all worked together.

It's the same way if they combined with the Legion, Vietnam, Marine Corps, etc. Some wanted to combine all the monies and work as one but those of an organization that had a great deal of money did not want to be the ones to fork over the majority of cash. No one could come up with a feasible way to run a place with three or four organizations, though it has been done in other towns.

- it never, ever will be what it was when Joe Thiede was there but it is same in all organizations right now. You have to find someone that really enjoys fixing the meals and tries to bring it up to snuff and not steal you blind. And that is difficult to do but it can be done...So new officers, God Bless and Good Luck.
- Many things have been tried. Some have worked and a lot have not. But one thing that might work is to get whoever would be willing, to do the calling of our members in McHenry County. A list of those members with their phone numbers would have to be accumulated and divided among the callers. We could ask them about their ideas and find out current information about them.

Years ago, when the now aging membership was young, we had projects for our children, such as Halloween & Christmas parties. The members had parties and entertainment, ball teams, bowling teams, work projects at the Post and involvement in community activities. There's no reason you younger Veterans couldn't be doing the same. As a Post member, it's your Post, and the facilities are yours to use (within the limits of the Post by-laws and building rules). But you've got to get active in the Post by showing up often and attending monthly meetings.


Turkey raffle tickets will be mailed out in late September. There are a few changes this year as you will see when you get your tickets. One change is that price per ticket is de-

Remember V-J Day?

August 14 and August 15 slipped by with virtually no attention in the news media about the significance of those two August dates. Those of our readers who remember World War II certainly know the significance of those dates, and it's sad to me that the younger generation does not know about the great danger this country faced that brought about World War II.

On August 14, 1945 President Harry Truman announced that Japan had surrendered to end World War II (V-J Day). President Truman proclaimed August 15, 1945 as a national day of thanksgiving.

In a way it's a tribute to the success of maintaining relative peace in decades since that today's young people have virtually no knowledge of events leading up to World War II and the wars that raged. The United States entered World War II after Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. The U.S. quickly entered the war in Europe which remind many people of a milestone date, namely, June 6, 1944, when allied troops landed on the coast of Normandy to begin the successful defeat of Germany. The war with Germany ended May 8, 1945 but the battle with Japan continued until mid-August.


I think it's timely that we remember these milestone dates and appreciate the

> We are undergoing similarly difficult times in Iraq and Afghanistan. It may not seem so dominant in our lifestyle and our


> day-to-day living, but consider the fact this war in Iraq has lasted much longer than World War II—and there is not sign of this current war ending soon.
