\$30M veterans facility in Woodstock discussed

News of a non-geriatric nursing home and supported living facilities for injured veterans to be located in Woodstock are under discussion but there is quite a distance to become a reality for a variety of reasons.

The plan discussed at the December 15 Woodstock City Council included construction of the nursing home on property across from the Wells Fargo (Wachovia) building on U.S. Route 14. The proposed construction is being discussed at the same meeting the city council considered relocating the site of the proposed baseball stadium -- a stadium for a minor league team that hopes to begin play in spring 2011.

Here's what we know about the veterans facility. Alan Belcher, Vietnam War veteran, told the city council the facility for veterans is needed.

"They deserve nothing but the best kind of care we can provide. Too many are housed in VA hospitals that do not provide adequate care. They need to be in a

community where they have access to people, activities and the outside world," said Belcher. These would be veterans wounded with traumatic brain injury or multiple limb loss.

Belcher emphasized the goal would be to help veterans reach their maximum level of functioning.

"An ultimate goal is to help them move into supportive living facility, permanent housing or return home," said Belcher.

Under the proposal Belcher said a first building would provide rehabilitation; a second building would provide supportive living, a place to live and continue receiving physical therapy. The presentation before the city council would provide a facility with 100 beds for veterans who need long-term care and up to 120 beds for disabled veterans.

Belcher told the city council, "We were notified this site was available, and it meets our needs. We are seriously interested in this property." Belcher remarked that the nature of the war in Iraq and Afghanistan, as well as improved body armor and medical treatment, has led to higher survival rates, but this also means more returning veterans have severe and long-lasting injuries.

With the Army Corps of Engineers holding up the proposed ball park stadium immediately across from the Wells Fargo building, stadium officials want to move the stadium east on the property. The discussed site for the stadium would be east of any extension of Doty Road, northwest of U.S. Route 14.

Apparently, the veterans facility would not be so large as to make it impractical to locate what's needed to care for veterans at the originally planned site for the stadium. Merryman Aggregate is mining gravel on the 240-acre site which extends east to Lilv Pond Road.

It seems apparent that the baseball stadium and the veterans facility are intermingled insofar as moving forward with either or both projects. This is in part due to the need to consider suitable access on U.S. Route 14 and roadways that would be

necessary on the property to meet the needs of stadium traffic and veterans facility traffic.

Changes to the project must be approved by the Woodstock planning commission, followed by a public hearing with the Woodstock City Council.

Belcher's involvement in this project comes from his leadership in establishing the Transitional Living Facility in Hebron in 1996. It opened in 2001. With a grant received last year, it not only houses veterans but serves as a link helping veterans find employment. Belcher knows firsthand the need for intensive care for returning veterans through his profession of counseling veterans.

About two years ago he began conversations with VA officials concerning the need for a specialized kind of facility. He hopes it will be started near Woodstock before the end of 2010. He has had discussions with the Housing & Urban Development (HUD).

If the application is accepted, HUD will guarantee up to 90 percent of the funding. estimated by one participant at \$30 million. About \$2 million would be required to be raised locally. Belcher is working closely with the McHenry County Community Foundation for that local support.




