However, there was an underlying theme for the night that I couldn't print in last month's paper and was passed by word of mouth. Even the man being honored for the night didn't know what it was about. You see, Don Sword was given an appreciation night in his honor, thanking him for his many years and dedication to VFW Post 5040.

Don had no idea what was going on. He explained, "You know, I came in tonight expecting to have a nice time and support the VFW in this function. When I came down the stairs, I thought I saw a few people that I know that would normally not be here at the Post. They were family. Then I began to think, 'What's going on?...No, it wasn't my birthday ... no, it wasn't our Anniversary which will be 59 years in April...what did I miss?' Something was up."

Well, Don found out pretty quickly what was up when many extended family and friends were gathered to help Post 5040 give an appreciation night for Don. Don has been a been a member of the Post for many years, helping in many annual fund raising activities, stepping up to chair the events, and sitting on the Association Board.

Don Peasley, the first VFW News Editor, was invited to sav a few words about Don and his recollections of Sword's dedication to the VFW. Of the many people Peasley has worked with, Peasley ranked Don Sword with some of the other people

that have done great work at the VFW: Joe Thiede, Jack Fish, Don and Maynard Wilkerson, Bud and Bob Hehler, Bob and Pat Gaylord, Nyda Fogarty, Chuck and Jim Gehrke, Dean Mishler, and many others.

As a military police officer in the Army of the Occupation in South Korea in 1945, Sword was eligible for VFW membership. In the late 1980's Don joined the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Drawing from his background in electronics. Don has installed and maintained various audio systems within our Post. He has been on the Association Board for over 20 years, been in charge of the Turkey Raffle held in November for numerous years, served as member of the Honor Guard, helped with Soup To Nuts, cleaned fryers, fixed kitchen appliances, and the list goes on.

Following Don Peasley's speech, Association President Bud Porter presented Don with an appreciation plaque which stated "In Heartfelt Appreciation for Unselfish Dedication to Country, Community and VFW Post 5040". Family and friends were then invited to say a few words if they wanted.

Don Sword's son, Jeff, came up from Aurora with his wife Debbie to pay tribute to their father. Don's daughter Linda Skocz, who lives in Arizona with husband Rod, was unable to attend. Their children John (wife Christine) and Nichole (husband Steve) were able to attend. Other friends and family were also present to give Don a bit of surprise by being at the VFW.

Jeff Sword voiced a heartfelt speech that covered what was likely on most of their family members minds. Jeff, a former Naval Intelligence Lieutenant Commander during the cold war, followed up his speech with messages from Jeff's own two sons dedicated to their Grandpa, Don Sword. If you know Don and have spoken to him, you know how proud he is of his grandsons and what they are doing now.

VFW Post 5040 nominations and elections for 2010-2011 Officer positions held in March

We are coming into that time of year when it's time to start thinking about our next years officers and who will be leading our Post.

At the March meeting, VFW Judge Advocate, Dick Glawe, and 3 Year Trustee, Arnie Doerfert, were appointed as the VFW election officials for the upcoming VFW Elections. Election will take place at the April meeting.

Procedurally, March is the first month in which officer nominations for the 2010-2011 VFW year will take place. At the April meeting, final nominations will be taken. Elections will then be conducted at the April meeting at the close of nominations.

Here is a summary of what is required of each of the elected positions and appointed positions in the VFW Post 5040. Officers are elected for a term of one year. Any of these positions are open for those that would like to get involved this year. Of course, some people will volunteer again or be asked to retain their positions. but we always like to have people step up and volunteer for things like this as well. Is this your year to get involved and try something different and new?

Commander (elected):

(a) Preside at all meetings, (b) enforce laws of VFW, (c) conduct business and activities according to VFW standards (d) decide all questions of law (f) approve expenditures (g) assure QM is bonded (h) assure all dues are forwarded to Department (i) assure all reports are correct (j) assure all eligible veterans encouraged to join and maintain membership (k) assure that he or representative attend District Conventions (1) comply with and perform duties of VFW.

Sr. Vice (elected):

Assist Commander in preserving order and preside in absence of Commander.

Jr. Vice (elected):

Assist Commander in preserving order and preside in absence of Commander and Sr. Vice Commander.

Quartermaster (elected):

(a) receive and properly account for all monies and property in Post (b) pay our

authorized payments (c) be bonded (d) collect monies giving receipts (e) keep dues accounts on members (f) collect annual membership dues (g) transmit dues to Department (h) refrain from issuing memberships until dues paid (i) maintain dues reserve (j) expend dues paid by Post on members form general fund (k) maintain relief fund (1) maintain books (m) deliver to successor all records (n) serve as treasurer in all committees (o) comply with all VFW laws.

Adjutant (elected):

(a) prepare all reports required of him (b) attest by signature all actions of the Post (c) keep in books: by laws, member applications, meeting minutes, orders from higher offices, correspondence file, proof of eligibility, roll of departed comrades (d) transfer all records to successor (e) comply with all VFW laws

Chaplain (elected):

Shall be chairman of visiting committee of Post. Visits sick and disabled members and make report to membership.

Judge Advocate (elected):

Gives commander legal assistance.

Surgeon (elected):

Chairman of Health committee. Shall promote and put into effect health programs for the benefit of the Post and community.

Officer of the Day (elected):

(a) Custodian of the Post colors, alter flag, Bible, ballot box, gavel and other such property (b) at the beginning of meeting, inspect membership card (c) have Post colors in position prior to meetings (d) at the close of meetings assures that all property is under his control (e) prepares ballots (f) carry out order of commander.

Trustees (elected):

(a) audit books and records of the Post (b) submit a Post trustees report of audit to Department QM (c) verify all expenditures (d) audit the records and accounts of all committees (e) perform duties that are incident to position. (Trustees are elected for a term to three years.)

Guard (elected):

(a) allow no one to enter meeting room who does not posses a dues receipt card or membership (b) notify Officer of the Day of all distinguished guests present (c) perform duties that are incident to position.

Service Officer (elected):

Assist members of the Post, widows, and orphans in obtaining rightful benefits from federal and state governments, preparing proper forms for applying for benefits, and assembling required evidence.

Assistant Adjutant (elected):

Assists Adjutant as requested.

Assistant Quartermaster (elected): Assists Quartermaster as requested.

Legislative Chairman:

Inform Post membership of all legislative information sent to him by Department or National.

Employment Chairman:

Work for the accomplishment of the employment programs adopted by the National and Departmental conventions and Post to promote employment of veterans.

Public Relations Chairman:

Publicize the activities of the Post which enhance the prestige of the Post and membership. He shall seek cooperation of local publications and broadcast media to obtain favorable publicity for the VFW of the US.

Americanism Chairman:

Maintains record of all Patriotic Days and shall initiate programs for their proper observance by the Post and community.

Post Newsletter Editor:

Responsible for creating newsletter format, editing written and pictorial content, organizing submitted content, producing electronic copy for print services, maintaining Post address list, printing address labels, tabbing and labeling newsletters, working with advertisers in ad development, renewal and changes, work with Post Office to qualify for bulk mail rates at pre-sort level.

Responsible for yearly renewal of domain name and web hosting service, updating web pages with content as needed, developing new web pages as needed, posting digital copy of newsletter to website, keeping maintenance costs to a minimum, answering email that comes through the website mailboxes. Basic knowledge of HTML, CSS, FTP, and CGI scripts is helpful.

Post Spirit Fund underway!

I was very proud that day, and every day, to know my grandfather served in that great war. The example you showed to my father and then to me through your service to country, and then community with the VFW, built the foundation of who I am today. As a fellow member of post 5040, I thank you for your sacrifice and service to the United States of America. I also thank you for your dedication to the VFW and your continued support of veterans and fellow service members. As we sailors say, Bravo Zulu!, well done. Don, on behalf the Post, thank you for all you've done. We all appreciate your work and dedication that you have provided to the Post over these many years.






