Past Commander LaVerne Emricson dies

Immediately after learning LaVern Emricson's death April 2, 2010, I reflected on his longtime role as a pillar in the VFW for more than 50 years.

Soon after ending his military service in 1956 he became a member of the VFW, filled positions of leadership and was elected Commander in 1964. His participation as a leader was most exemplified when current officers turned to him for advice in early 2010.

LaVern finished his military service in the U.S. Army with the Occupation in Germany 1955-1956. As Commander he helped tremendously with the success of the VFW, by sponsoring drum and bugle corps in the V-J Day Parades for 20 years, 1955 through 1974.

VFW officers remember his business sense when turning to LaVern. He was appointed an officer with the Post. Bud Porter, VFW board president, observed, "LaVern's business background helped us receive excellent advice."

Mike David, VFW director, added "LaVern was a great help to the VFW. He was a quiet, thoughtful man. He did not have a lot to say but when he spoke, we listened."

LaVern was a determined, achievement-driven man with a business acumen exemplified by success in the machining trade.

I was privileged to be associated with LaVern in so many activities. My first memory was to take a photo of him as a handsome high school senior to promote a special exercise equipment. A recent activity with LaVern was to appreciate his contribution to discussions as a member of the board of directors at Woodstock Christian Life Services.

He became intimately familiar with the operation activities of the nursing home because of regular visits to a longtime family friend.

His daughter Shelly Eslick, one of several family members in the family business Emtech (a leading Woodstock business) describes her father as "a hard worker and very driven."

"My Dad was strong-willed. His keen business experience guided him when he established Trakk Industrial Park in the mid-1990s," said Shelly. His work on a farm while in high school, at G & H Production, research to establish Trakk Industrial Park and working at Auto-Lite for a short time all contributed to his business abilities.

From his start as a machine operator at G & H Production in 1961 he advanced up the managerial ladder to purchase the company in 1984 (changing the name to Emtech). LaVern moved Emtech from a building on Illinois Route 120 northwest to the business park in 1997; today all but five of the 33 lots are occupied.

LaVern provided strong support for many community projects with financial contributions. He supported Dick Tracy Day Parades, summer entertainment in Woodstock. LaVern was in the background while providing help to many local events. He was a leader in supporting Christmas Clearing House, for example.


He and his wife Charlotte were married in 1957 soon after he returned from overseas military duty. She recalled his generosity and determination to succeed.

His son Steve remembers his Dad for his strength of character. "A handshake meant something to Dad," he said, and then he began to smile as he recalled fishing and hunting trips with his father. LaVern is in the Fisherman's Hall of Fame in Hayward, Wisconsin.

When his children were growing up LaVern coached the girls in softball. His Little League activities included coaching the Red Sox when his son Steve was playing. He was also president of the Teener League (13-15-year-olds).

LaVern was born November 2, 1934 to Thore and Hulda (Schultz) Emricson. He married Charlotte L. Hunt March 2, 1957 in Woodstock. Survivors include his wife Charlotte; a son, Steve (Melody) Emricson; four daughters, Shelly (Tom) Eslick, Woodstock; Sharon (Dan) McMillan, Harvard; Sara (Denny) Jackson, McHenry; and Susan (Andy) Jones, Harvard; and 14 grandchildren.

Hello,

I have been doing some research and would like to know if a flag for your parade was given to you by Florence and Robert Lounsbery. Their son Thomas was killed on the Arizona at Pearl Harbor. He was my uncle.

Robert and Florence were my grandparents. My mother was their daughter and the sister of Tom. Could you verify this [the flag]?

I believe the flag was given by my grandmother but not sure when. I'm sure it was handed over personally by my grandmother. She lived in the town for 92 years until her death in 1985.

I also know that he, Thomas, was the 1st casualty of the war from Woodstock. I was told that it is used in the town's parade. I have two teenage sons and it might be good for them to watch the parade and maybe get to see the flag.

The VFW 5040 Honor Guard

This month, we remember those veterans that died in current and previous wars and take a moment to honor them.

In doing so, perhaps the thought may have crossed your mind of what would happen if you were to die, what type of services would be available for your family to help in honoring you in death?

The VFW Post 5040 has an Honor Guard available for one hour during the wake or just before the service at the funeral home or church. For Post members, the American and Post flags would be situated on either side of the casket.

Also available at the cemetery or at the service, a rifle squad would fire three volleys. We also have a bugler that would play, and the folding and presenting of the flag to the next of kin would also take place.

We don't have a set of rules we always follow at each service and will do as little or as much as requested by the widow. Death is not easy for those left behind, but we try to honor our fallen comrades in the most dignified way possible.

It is very important that the family knows the location of the veterans honorable discharge papers (sometimes called the DD214). The funeral director must have this to obtain the burial flag and the cemetery will need it for the government furnished bronze plate.

If you don't have your discharge papers, now might be a good time to give the Veterans Assistance Commission (VAC) of McHenry County a call. Mike Iwanicki, Superintendent of the VAC and Post 5040's Service Officer, can help track this down. For some of you, this document may already be registered with the County.

One final piece of information. People are not entitled to a twenty-one gun salute. Only the President is entitled to this and it is done so with a cannon. The Chief of Staff is entitled to an eighteen-gun salute. I learned this while attending the Commissioning of the new cruiser, the USS Anzio. A rifle squad at a burial may consist from five to eight riflemen and they fire three volleys.

The Honor Guard and rifle squad do not charge a fee for the services provided to our veterans, but we do accept donations to help cover transportation and meal costs.




