VFW Members at our October Post meeting again voted to sponsor the VFW Team in the Junior Division for 13 & 14 year olds of the Woodstock Little League.

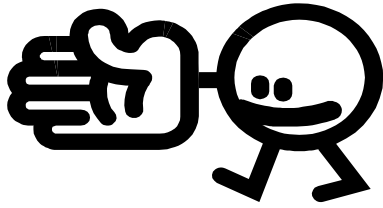
Post 5040 is and has been one of the main sponsors of this age group since the 1979 season .

### NEW YOUTH ESSAY CONTEST ANNOUNCED!

Commander James R. Smith has appointed three-time Past Post Commander Dwayne E. Raney to chair a newly formed committee and oversee the **PATRIOT'S PEN WRITING CONTEST** here in Woodstock. The contest is designed for 7th & 8th grade students only.

The theme for this 2002-2003 competition is, "**MY PLEDGE TO AMERICA**". The length of the essay is to be 300 to 400 words, typewritten or computer print out.

An official student entry form is to be completed by the student, with parent or guardian signature. Either the Post Commander, the Ladies Auxiliary President, or the Post Chairman, must complete the official entry form.

The **DEADLINE** for students to enter is **DECEMBER 1st, 2002**. Post judging must be completed by January 1st, 2003. The 5th VFW District judging will take place on January 11th, 2003, at the Round Lake Beach Village Hall, at 224 West Clarendon Drive, Round Lake Beach, Illinois, 60073. All VFW and Auxiliary members are welcome to attend the judging.

District prizes are the same as last year's:

- 1st place: \$200 savings bond.
- 2nd place: \$150 savings bond.
- 3rd place: \$100 savings bond.

National VFW prizes:

- 1st place: \$10,000 bond.
- 2nd place: \$7000 bond.
- 3rd place: \$5500 bond.
- 4th place: \$5000 bond.
- 5th thru 7th places: \$3000 bond.
- 8th place: \$2500 bond.
- 9th place: \$2000 bond.
- 10th place: \$1500 bond.
- 11th thru 19th places: \$1000 bond.

The number of winners at the post level will depend on how many students and schools participate. The Standardized Quota System is being used as found in the Chairman's Workbook. Each post has the option of the single winner or multi winner.

Hopefully, the parents and grandparents will encourage their 7 and 8 year olds to participate. It's a good experience and a great way to earn a U.S. Savings Bond as well.

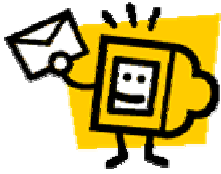
