Belcher Receives Buschkopf Award

Among VFW and American Legion veterans, Alan Belcher, 56, is well-known for his support, such as his founding the shelter for veterans in need in Hebron. Recognition of Belcher's service to the community was recognized outside the veterans' circle when the Woodstock Chamber of Commerce and Industry chose him to receive the Harold Buschkopf Award, Saturday, January 18.

The award is named after a Woodstock pharmacist who was an outstanding community leader, business promoter and civic activist. James Keefe, 71, was also named recipient of the Harold Buschkopf Award. Presentation was made by Steve Buschkopf, Harold's son.

Belcher's wife Gay was among the 120 guests at the Chamber's 58th annual meeting. Keefe, who was hospitalized for surgery a few days earlier, was represented at the dinner by his four children: Erin Anderegg, Kelly Afeld, Pat Keefe and Quinn Keefe. Belcher's contribution includes service to veterans and rejuvenating the city's Memorial Day program.

In the mid-1990s he began serving as an officer of the Woodstock VFW and was elected Commander in 1999. When the Commander's chair became vacant during a crisis in June 2001, Belcher stepped forward to once again become Commander and preserve the integrity of the 55-year-old VFW.

When it seemed likely Memorial Day observances would fade away, Belcher took the lead 10 years ago to rally the VFW, American Legion and VietNow members to conduct appropriate ceremonies in the Square. A Memorial Day committee now meets virtually year-round to line up musical guests, student participants, keynote speaker and parade marshal.

One of his greatest achievements has

been overcoming skepticism about helping homeless veterans. He took the lead in organizing Transitional Living Services to purchase the Hi-De-Ho Motel in Hebron as a shelter for homeless veterans. New Horizon opened July 1, 2001.

Belcher volunteers about 20 hours a week at the shelter, handling administrative duties and searching for grants. His example has inspired others to help veterans in need.

Belcher is an original member of the McHenry County Continuum of Care Board, which proposes developments to

meet housing and service needs. He has served on the McHenry County Development Block Grant Commission to obtain federal funding for agencies that serve the homeless.

As a counselor, Belcher's practice includes working with people suffering with multiple personality disorder. He gives workshops throughout the state on Post-Traumatic Stress Syndrome.

Keefe was recognized for his community involvement in a large number of activities. As a member of the Woodstock Rotary, he was an important leader in a youth exchange program bringing students from many other countries to Woodstock. Jim and Mary Ellen Keefe provided a home-away-from-home for 16 foreign students over a period of several years.

Keefe has served on the Woodstock Public Library board, Memorial Hospital board, Woodstock Police Commissions board, and on the Woodstock City Council with Mayor Mel Stuessy and Mayor Frances Kuhn. He was a charter member and past president of the Woodstock Jaycees.

Keefe grew up in Woodstock and has been active in many programs and services at St. Mary's Church where he is a daily communicant. He may be best recognized, however, for his interest in Woodstock history. He has gathered photographs from many sources, prepared a slide show and presents it to school and club groups with a running commentary.

The award was established in 1991 following Buschkopf's untimely death. Previous Buschkopf award recipients include John Lillie, Dr. Bernard Neuchiller, Ray Benoy, Virgil Smith, Don Peasley, Cheryl Wormley, Helen Fields, Jane Griffin and Charie Zanck.


