Memorial Day Observed In Woodstock

Veterans from World War I, World War II, Korean, Vietnam and Desert Storm wars led Woodstock's Memorial Day observance in the Woodstock Square on Memorial Day, Monday, May 26. The annual Memorial Day observance was conducted by Woodstock VFW, Woodstock American Legion, McHenry County Marine Corps League and veterans of the Vietnam War.

Alan Belcher, master of ceremonies, said the gathering was to pay homage to thousands of Americans who fought and died for our freedom. The invocation was given by Dwayne Raney, representing the American Legion.

"Several hundred more names have been added to that honor roll," said Belcher, referring to the deaths during the Iraqi war in March and April. Deaths from that military action continue to mount because of suicide bombers, accidents, faulty equipment and

continued military action.

State Senator Adeline Geo-Karis asserted, "Freedom does not come free. We have to sacrifice." She referred to a parody of "In Flanders Field" Moina Michel wrote in 1915 saying "To cherish too the poppy red that grows in fields where valor led it seem to signal to the skies the blood of heroes never dies." Her inspiration led to the sale of poppies to raise money for servicemen.

"In 1922 VFW began selling poppies nationally. In 1924 they sold artificial poppies made by disabled veterans to provide support for hospitalized veterans," said Geo-Karis. This is a Wood-

stock VFW tradition each May the weekend before Memorial Day.

Geo-Karis was enthusiastic with the large crowd in the Woodstock Square. She recalled coming to the United States in 1922 when she was four years old.

"I remember the reaction of the people aboard that ship when they saw the Statue of Liberty," she said. Her political career extends over 30 years. Geo-Karis served in the Illinois House from 1973 to 1979. She has been an Illinois senator since 1979. In 1992 she became the first woman appointed to

serve as a senate majority leader.

U.S. House of Representative member Don Manzullo reminded listeners that through the years many American men and women have given their lives to preserve freedom, making the world a better place to live.
