
Thanks to all that participated in the events for this day, and thank you to the volunteers that helped with the preparation, serving, and cleanup of the hall and kitchen. You all did a fine

The End of Bingo at the Post?

As some of you may be aware, bingo played at the post has been a losing proposition for the past several months. With each Friday night bingo that is played at the post, we barely cover the costs of keeping the facility open. Usually the turnout has been very low.

The VFW Post 5040 is considering canceling bingo for the coming year or reducing the number of times a month that it is played.

If we do cancel bingo, final money in the bingo account is ours to do what ever we want. We must show where it went though. It can be transferred into other post accounts to help out with facility upkeep, helping veterans, etc. We must keep this record for three years in case we want to bring back bingo. We do not lose the pull-tabs license if we cancel bingo.

If we keep bingo going, the renewal fee is \$200 if the VFW decides to keep the license. We can play 1 or 2 days a month if we want to. A board officer must be on premise and be in charge of the games played, but does not have to work. The Auxiliary could be the workers. The ladies cannot sell pulltabs; only the VFW can do this.

If we give up the license, it will take the Auxiliary at least 3 weeks to get a license. Have an opinion on this? Write the post or come to the next meeting to express your concerns.

cant, millions of these flags flying across the nation collectively say to everyone we believe in everyone's right to pursue happiness, that we believe in the freedom described in the Bill of Rights, and that we will protect them," said Belcher.

Belcher reviewed the start of New Horizons saying seven years ago a group of veterans met to find a way to provide housing and service to homeless veterans. Today, trained counselors are able to help train men for jobs and to help them find work and a place to live. Several computers have been purchased to help the men learn computer skills.

New Horizons opened to receive veterans in August 2001. The facility is located in the former Hi-De-Ho Motel north of Hebron on Illinois Route 47.


