
As a reminder, items should be clean and in books, dishes, curtains, bedspreads, appliances, tools, furniture, etc.



# Ticket Information on WWII Memorial Dedication

A Message from the Director, National WWII Memorial Dedication Washington, D.C., Jan. 21, 2004--We are fast approaching the long-awaited May 29 dedication of the National World War II Memorial. These events will celebrate our nation's newest national memorial and pay tribute to those who served during World War II on the battlefront and on the home front.

The following is important information related to Dedication Weekend, particularly since many VFW members may be planning to visit D.C. for these celebrations.

Due to the overwhelming demand for tickets to the Dedication events, the number of requests received now exceeds the number of seats available for both the Dedication Ceremony on the National Mall (106,000) and all three "Salute to World War II Veterans" shows at the MCI Center (33,000 @ 11.000 each).

We can no longer accept requests for the Salute to Veterans shows. Demand has far exceeded the seats available, so an extensive wait-list already exists.

However, VFW members can call the toll free hotline at 800-639-4992, or log onto www.wwiimemorial.com, to be placed on a wait-list should tickets to the dedication ceremony become available in the coming months. Individuals and tour groups that have already requested tickets will be notified via mail by February 15 of their ticket fulfillment. Individuals on the wait-list will be notified by mail no later than March 30 if their request can be fulfilled.

It is unfortunate that not all requests can be fulfilled, but we can only put so many chairs on the event grounds. We want you to know, however, that ticket priority is being given to members of the World War II generation. In fact, for priority seating each WWII generation member is allowed only two guests so that as many WWII honorees as possible can be seated.

While tens of thousands of veterans and their families will See Memorial, page 6.

be in D.C., even more members of the WWII generation will gather with friends and family to celebrate the opening in community observances and festivities around the country, in many cases at events organized by local veteran service organizations. We will be providing a live satellite feed of the ceremony that will be available for such events, and the general public will have the opportunity to view the ceremony on live network or cable television.

You should also be aware that the city of Washington will follow the dedication with a city-wide, summer-long celebration entitled America Celebrates the Greatest Generation, a collection of more than 60 WWII-themed exhibitions, performances, walking tours, and hotel packages in Washington, D.C., and the Capital Region running from Memorial Day to Labor Day 2004. For more details, visit America's Greatest Generation (www.washington.org/americacelebrates) or Washington, D.C. events (www.washington.org/index.cfm).

VFW members who do not receive tickets to the official dedication events should be encouraged to plan their trips to Washington for later in the summer when they will still be treated as honorees, but not have to endure the large crowds we expect on the Mall in late May.
