Community Builders Award Given to VFW Member Alan Belcher

Alan Belcher, 1965 Woodstock High School graduate and an infantryman in Vietnam from October 1967 until May 1969, has been named recipient of the Woodstock Masonic Lodge's Community Builders Award. Henry Nulle, Master, made the presentation before the Lodge's March meeting at the Farm Bureau building.

Belcher is a counselor at Cornerstone Counseling where he specializes in family and marriage counseling and in post-traumatic stress disorder. Belcher worked in his chosen field for several years when someone approached him and told him Vietnam veterans were having problems with benefits and with readjustment.

Belcher was among those organizing a VietNow group and demanding that the federal government clean up the Veterans Administration hospital system. What started as a grassroots activism became a life of service.

In 1985 he was presented the VietNow Award. In 1987 he was given the Vietnam Veterans Leadership Program Award. The Woodstock Lions Club named Belcher its Citizen of the Year in 2001. In 2003 the Woodstock Chamber of Commerce recognized Belcher's community involvement with the Harold Buschkopf Award.

Belcher's involvement in the VFW has been extensive and significant. He has served as Post Commander and returned to that office when the VFW was in a serious position with

the State VFW. For many years Belcher has been an active member of the Memorial Day committee. One of his proudest involvements was to be chairman when the Traveling Vietnam Memorial Wall came to Woodstock for Memorial Day in 2002.

During the presentation of the Community Builders Award, Nulle pointed out Belcher's determination to help homeless veterans in McHenry County. He organized a board, established New Horizons corporation, purchased the Hi-De-Ho Motel in Hebron and turned it into a home for 14 veterans.

The program includes job training, such as mastering the computer, and transportation in the search for jobs.

Belcher and his wife, Gay, live in Woodstock. Gay is a schoolteacher at Clay Street School.



Attention WWII Veterans!

From the WWII Registry on the Internet

The memory of America's World War II generation will be preserved within the physical memorial and through the World War II Registry of Remembrances, an individual listing of Americans who contributed to the war effort.

Any U.S. citizen who helped win the war, whether a veteran or someone on the home front, is eligible for the Registry. Names in the Registry will be forever linked to the memorial's bronze and granite representations of their sacrifice and achievement.

The Registry combines four distinct databases that can be searched for names of those whose service and sacrifice helped win the Second World War. The Registry includes the names of Americans who are:

- Buried in American Battle Monuments Commission (ABMC) overseas military cemeteries.
- Memorialized on ABMC Tablets of the Missing.
- Listed on official War and Navy Department Killed in Service rosters now held by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA).
- Honored by public enrollment in the Registry of Remembrances.




