AABB (formerly known as the American Association of Blood Banks), in conjunction with America's Blood Centers and American Red Cross, is celebrating National Volunteer Blood Donor Month (NVBDM) in January 2005 to encourage donors to give or pledge to give blood.

Heartland Blood Centers will be on site **January 30** with Heartland's Mobile Coach located at the Woodstock VFW in the parking lot. Every Heartland Blood Donor receives a **\$25 gift certificate** from Restaurant.com.

In addition to the blood drive, the VFW will be cooking up an **All-You-Can-Eat Pancake Breakfast** for \$5.00 per person. Donation time and the Pancake Breakfast will be from 10 am to 3 pm. Even if you don't donate, please come down for the breakfast and support the post and donors who are giving blood. We need donors!

Traditionally, blood is in short supply during the winter months due to the holidays, travel schedules, inclement weather and illness. January, in particular, is a difficult month for blood centers to collect blood donations. A reduction in turnout can put our nation's blood inventory at a critical low.

Every day in our country, approximately 38,000 units of blood are required in hospitals and emergency treatment facilities for patients with cancer and other diseases, for organ transplant recipients, and to help save the lives of accident victims. Our goal is to help ensure that blood is available to patients whenever and wherever it is needed because it is the blood on the shelves that helps saves lives.

The sole existence of Woodstock VFW Post 5040 falls to a select few who, out of respect, pride, and belief that the VFW is a quality organization, dutifully continue to help out the post by donating time, volunteering their skills, and patronize the post canteen.

So where does this put us? Reliance on you.
