VFW Post 5040 60th anniversary celebrated on April 29

All I can say is "what a party it was!". Honestly, I have only attended a limited number of VFW specific functions held by our Post and this one was the best I have ever seen as far as turnout goes. There were between 275 to 300 people that attended the dinner on April 29 to celebrate Post 5040's 60 year anniversary. Our Post was officially charted on March 4, 1946.

Guests were treated to a decorated Post especially for the occasion. In the lower level, our newly renovated bar area displayed better lighting above the bar and at the side tables on either side of it, a refinished bar surface, newly painted walls and ceiling, a new compact juke box, and well placed memorabilia on the walls of the bar. These new changes to the downstairs were part of several thousand dollars of member authorized renovations that were very much needed. In addition to the bar area, in the lower meeting hall new hanging lights were added to brighten up the area.

Near the bar, situated between both sets of stairs that lead down to the meeting area, a long table from one stair to the other, a backboard displayed pictures of VFW Post members from when they entered the service. On the tables themselves were photo albums, letters, booklets, maps, etc. that members had given to Bud Pflug to display this night. Towards the kitchen, another display set on a table that was made of pine frames and backed in chicken wire. Attached to the chicken wire were pistols, knives, canteens, a helmet, and other war memorabilia items covering many of the wars our members were in. I was a very well done display. Thanks a lot to Bud and those that helped in preparing this display.

The downstairs was primarily set up for as a dance floor, entertainment provided for the evening by Freddy and Lorrie Lamberti of the duo Talisman. Most of the

guests, when not downstairs getting a refreshment at the bar or looking at the displays, were in the upstairs meeting room.

Most everyone quickly ended upstairs to grab a seat before the program began. Master of Ceremonies, Sid Sherwin, Past Commander Post 5040, began the night with the *Pledge of Allegiance* followed by the Invocation given by Chaplain Howard Engstrom.

Dinner at 6:30 was buffet style, prepared by Coleman's in Woodstock. Dinner was roast beef, fried chicken, mashed potatoes and gravy, corn, bun, and a salad. Keeping plates cleared and water glasses and coffee cups full were volunteers from the Woodstock Little League who were a big help this night to keep things moving. A big thank-you to them for donating their time and man-power in this celebration.

After dinner, current Commander Thom Gillespie gave a Welcome speech followed by Sid Sherwin introducing the Past Commanders and Past Auxiliary Presidents present at the dinner. Founding editor of the VFW News Don Peasley then gave a Reflection on Post 5040 History. Past Commander Alan Belcher proceeded to Honor the Charter Members present followed again by Thom Gillespie Honoring the family of Art Schuld Jr.

Two special awards were given out this night as well. For the Superior VFW Member Award, Bob Gibson was honored. For the Ray Benoy Outstanding Service Award, Chuck Ruth was honored.

Closing prayer was again given by Howard Engstrom.



Special awards given at 60th anniversary

Two men were honored with special recognition during the Woodstock VFW's 60th anniversary celebration on April 29.

Alan Belcher, anniversary committee member, presented the "Ray Benoy Outstanding Service Award" to Charles Ruth, prominent Woodstock businessman and community leader.

Sid Sherwin, committee co-chairman, presented the "Superior VFW Member Award" to 87-year-old Bob Gibson.

Following a recitation of accomplishments of the two men, each was presented a personalized art by Tom Trausch, nationally-acclaimed Woodstock artist.

Sherwin explained Gibson had worked regularly around the VFW Post Home and added, "No job is too tough, too dirty, too big or too small for Gibson. He has served on the Rifle Squad, he's been a trustee, he's worked at the Post Home for at least 20 hours a week as a volunteer for over 10 years."

Ruth owns Alliance Contractors. Belcher cited a recent example of Ruth's generosity. His company provided the material, expertise and workmanship to build a divider at the parking lot when the City of Woodstock and the VFW returned the parking area on Throop Street to its original format.

Belcher also cited other examples of Ruth "helping the little guy." His company helped Public Action to Deliver Shelter (PADS) by donating a foundation for its new building. His company built a base and erected a flagpole at the veterans' shelter in Hebron.

When veterans wanted to move the Vietnam Memorial from the east side of the Government Center, Alliance Contractors moved it to its present location at the front of the County Administration Building on Ware Road.

Gibson, enlisted in the U.S. Navy in May 1942. He served in the Pacific Theater. After being discharged in 1945 he went to work for Dean Foods Company but after the start of the Korean War he was recalled to active duty in 1951.

After experiencing serious auditory nerve damage he was discharged and returned to work at Dean Foods where he also continued his activity as a member of the Dairy Employees Union.

Commenting on Gibson's energy and work at the VFW Post, he joked, "Bob is the only 87-year-old man who wears out three pairs of tennis shoes a year."

Woodstock VFW news founder, Don Peasley, publishes photo collection

Vignettes of Woodstock and McHenry County history come alive through 60 pages in a collection of photographs by Don Peasley.

Published with the title, A Collection of Memories, the 201 photos feature personalities and timely events from Don's career as an editor, photographer, columnist and historian since 1947.

The collection emphasizes photos taken for publications he produced. The publication, *Woodstock VFW NEWS*, featured photographs of men and women serving needy veterans and captured 15 national VFW "Best Post Publication" awards.

A Collection of Memories has 10 pages of VFW highlights, including programs and services of veterans during the past 60 years. The photos include charter members, Past Commanders, VFW community projects, and memories of the V-J Day Parade.

Nancy Fike, McHenry County Historical Society, said the photos document major social and economic changes in McHenry County.

"The photos provide visible documentation of people and events," said Fike.

Don's photo collection, basis for this book of memories, have been given to the Historical Society and kept there for the benefit of the public to conduct research or to simply enjoy happenings of yester-year.

Fike observes the photo collection allows the Historical Society to do a better job of tracking history and displaying these photos to the public.


