Post officers in place

Two World War II veterans have stepped forward to assume leadership of the Woodstock VFW Post 5040. As the VFW enters its 61st year, an Army infantryman and a Navy amphibious force veteran have agreed to assume the leading offices of the 500-member organization.

All officers were installed at the Post on June 19. They assumed office at the close of the annual Illinois VFW Convention

Bill Lyford, who served as an infantryman in the European Theater from 1943 to 1945, took part in seven major campaigns starting on the Anzio Beach. He was elected Commander. Earlier he served as Junior Vice Commander and Senior Vice Commander, and then served two years as Commander, 1998 and 1999.

Henry Nulle served in the Navy from 1944 to 1948. He was aboard an LST converted to an engine repair ship where Nulle service in the Pacific Theater.

Lyford noted the organization has been strengthened with several longtime members coming forward to fill key offices. Thom Gillespie, who served as Commander for the past two years, agreed to fill the difficult office of Quartermaster. Harold Irwin will continue as Post Surgeon, an office he's held for several years. Fred Noble is a relatively new member and has agreed to serve as Junior Vice Commander.

At the monthly meeting June 19 Don Sword discussed plans for the VFW to staff a booth in Building D during the McHenry County Fair August 2-6. The purpose of the booth is to make veterans aware of the membership benefits and to solicit contributions to support service to veterans, Sword said.

Veteran's appreciation weekend in Harvard

HARVARD, IL - A Veteran-themed weekend is expected to lure thousands of veterans and visitors to Harvard, IL for a variety of free events the weekend of August 18-20.

The Tiger I tank used in the filming of the 1998 Steven Spielberg movie 'Saving Private Ryan' will make its first-ever Illinois appearance in Harvard August 19-20, as part of a World War II re-enactment event. The tank will be on display at Lion's Park throughout the weekend.

World War II re-enactment groups from Northern Illinois and Southern Wisconsin will recreate military encampments and exercises at Lion's Park on Saturday and Sunday. Skirmishes are scheduled for 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. on August 19 and at 11 a.m. on August 20. Visitors can tour the encampments, take photos and talk to reenactors on both days when demonstrations are not in progress.

There will also be exhibits of memorabilia from World War II, Korea and Vietnam on display at Lion's Park throughout the re-enactment event, including uniforms, military gear, flags, films, vehicles and more. Visitors are encouraged to bring their cameras.

The Vietnam Memorial Traveling Wall will arrive in Harvard on Friday, August 18 and remain on display at the Diggins Library, 900 E. McKinley Street, through Sunday, August 20. The memorial will be manned and open continuously from 3 p.m. on Friday, August 18 through 3 p.m. on Sunday, August 20.

A USO-theme dance will be held at 7 p.m. on August 19 at The Stratford Ban-

quet Hall, 21007 McGuire Road in Harvard. The event, which will be similar to the dances held by the USO for uniformed service personnel during World War II, is open to the public and will feature music from the 1940's and 1950's. Attendees are encouraged to dress the part and dance the night away.

All four events are open to the public and are free. Donations will be accepted at each event site to help cover costs. Food will also be available for sale at all events.


