Sid Sherwin, VFW Post 5040 past Commander, is chairing a blood drive for the VFW at the end of January. The blood drive is scheduled for January 21 (that's a Sunday) from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm. The blood collection agency that will be on site is Heartland Blood Center which will have a mobile coach in the VFW Parking lot to perform the collections.

To help replenish you after you give blood, Sid and the officers will be cooking a Pancake Breakfast. Even if you are unable to donate, come on down for the breakfast. This will be open to anyone. Those not donating will have to pay for a meal (\$5), but if you donate, your meal is free! If you plan to donate, remember to:

- Bring a photo ID with you.
- Be in good health and feeling well.
- Eat something before you donate.
- It must be greater than 8 weeks since your last whole blood donation.
- If you received any body piercings or tattoos for Christmas, you'll have to wait 12 months before you can donate.

## Did you know:

• More than 500 blood donations are needed daily to save patient lives.

- Every 3 seconds someone needs blood.
- Blood donated to Heartland Blood Centers is provided to hospitals in Illinois and Indiana.
- Blood is needed every minute of EVERY day, summer, winter, spring
- Only about five percent of the eligible population donates blood.
- You can donate blood every 56 days.
- Donating one unit of blood can help save the lives of at least three people.

Pre-signup for donating blood is preferred. For an appointment, please contact the Woodstock VFW at 815-338-5040, or Sid Sherwin at 815-338-5573. Please bring a photo ID to the blood drive.

# My memories of Fred Wallis 1931-2006

On December 17, 2006 a memorial service was held for Frederick "Fred" Wallis. He was a Life Member of our Post and a Korean War veteran. # Current operations at our Post

First, I would like to thank Matt Klos, the membership and the Post's Officers for recognizing my efforts at the VFW. I feel very fortunate to have been given the opportunity to have the job as the club manager. For the most part (about 99%) of the time, I have never felt "dumped on" and ves, there have been times when I felt there was so much more to do here at the Post than I could handle.

This post needs it's members to survive. There are so many people that are here, day in and day out, volunteering their time, doing what it is that they do best, doing the things that are important to them, and in the timeframe that fits their life and lifestyle that keeps this place going. For all of that, I am very thankful to each and everyone.

It is that 99% of the time, that is the best part. I really do enjoy what you (the Post) let me do here. It doesn't have anything to do with the "paycheck". If anyone really took the time to see what I am paid here, they would very easily see that I make only about half of the Federal minimum wage based on the hours that I put in. A very good friend of mine (our Bar Manager "Miss Wonderful" aka Peggy) has a saying, "Sometimes, less is more". That sentiment is so accurate about how I feel about working at the VFW. I receive so much more back from spending time at the Post than money could ever buy. Less is definitely more!

Matt is also right that the Post is getting back on solid ground. As of last December, the bar/canteen account held only about \$675. As of the first week this De-

cember, it's balance was just below \$6,000. It has also for the first time in many years been paying for all of it's own fees, such as licenses and fees needed to operate under federal, state, county and city ordinances as well as the workman's compensation insurance. In the past few vears, the Post account has had to not only cover these expenses, but also transfer anywhere between \$2,000 to \$5,000 per month to continue the operation of running the bar and kitchen.

In reviewing the income and expenditures for all of the Post's accounts from January 1, 2006 to November 30, 2006, the Post's overall outflow exceeded it's income by \$19,352.03. Of this figure, \$9,416.18 was spent on renovations to the building while another \$3,259.17 was spent on updating the furnaces. The renovations and upgrading the furnace have greatly improved the overall appearance as well as reduced the cost of our gas bill. However, the bottom line is that the expenditures still exceed our income by \$6,676.68.

The Post Donated \$600 to the VFW 5th District, \$266 to Adult and Child Rehab Center, \$100 to Christmas Clearing House, \$275 to American Legion/Boys State, \$850 to TLS, \$200 to Westlake Church, \$123 VFW National Home, \$300 to Little League totaling \$2,714 from January 1, 2006 to November 30, 2006. For this same period of time, the Relief Fund has had \$2,045.11 in expenditures.

Other than the above mentioned expenditures, all other expenses are bills that are necessary for the Post to continue operating the building. These are not bills that we can just say "I think it costs too much or I think I'll pay it later. Everyone knows that property taxes, utility bills, insurance,

repairs and maintenance are not "optional" nor do we get to say what we are "willing" to pay for these things.

We have opened our doors to many organizations that meet at the Post on a very regular basis. No organization is made to feel that they are more or less important than any other. The VFW Board of Officer's is responsible to see that the operation of the building is being handled properly. Based on the amount of expenditures, the post needs to bring in approximately an additional \$20 per day to maintain the operation of the building for it's future to continue. If it doesn't, at the rate of excess from January to November 2006, the post will run out of funds in the savings account in approximately 3 years. At that time, it is very possible that there won't be a building for any of the organizations to meet at.

There are many things that these organizations can do to help us maintain our building and keep our costs in line. Most of these things are as simple as letting us know what time frame your group will be in the building, or if your group is not going to make it in on a given night, and simply cleaning up the area you were in before you leave. These things may seem small and petty, however, they are issues that cost the post money (utility, employee, taxes, and insurance expenses to name a few) that could be used in a better manner.

While reading this, it may seem bleak, however, it is anything but. We had very few hall rentals for private parties this last year. We already have more bookings scheduled for the next few months than we had altogether last year. I also have a few that are still in the works for other dates.

We are now also hosting a monthly dinner for the McHenry County Marine Corps League. The National Guard board is also now meeting here on occasion at the post. We are bringing more and more veterans in general to our post. They may or may not be eligible as members to the VFW, but they are veterans none the less, and above all, deserve respect.

1947-48. Genevieve Conway — In the first year of our Auxiliary, members went to Downey Hospital twice a month. Members were required to give pass word to the Conductress at the beginning of each meeting.

1948-49 Alta Kirkman — Meeting changed from 2nd and 4th Wednesday night to the 1st and 3rd

Thursdays.

1949-50 Irene Gorenflo - First Carnival sponsored by Post and Auxiliary, with a profit from food stand of over \$800. We were working in the dark, not knowing anything, served frozen buns and hot pop because we had so many people and they didn't seem to mind.

1950-51 Robin Kennedy - Much refurbishing of Club during this time to make it more attractive. Donation of two wheelchairs to county.

1951-52 Patricia Gaylord — First time no one would accept the Presidency at the end of her year. We had to have a special meeting for nominations, or the Auxiliary would have had to give up. Only time the Festival was scheduled to run 5 days; due to

poor weather, it was extended 3 more days. 1952-53 Ruby Wilkerson — Picked out the dishes for the Auxiliary kitchen.

1953-54 Joan Mansfield - First family potlucks started, and we didn't know how many to expect and had spaghetti coming "out of our ears." 1954-55 Eleanor Kesselring — Largest crowd ever to attend installation ceremonies to that date. May


