### A war, a flag, a name, a mystery By Matt Klos, VFW News Editor

When you opened up this page, you were probably shocked to see a Nazi swastika symbol staring back at you. Got your attention, didn't it?

Kind of like the email that I received that started this whole thing. On October 23, I received an email with the subject line as "German Flag Info". I never know what might be in these emails addressed to me because some are people looking for answers, some are junk mail - - but this one made me read that subject line again. "German Flag Info". What the heck might this be?

Opening up the mail, I found it was from a New Jersey fireman who is a World War II history buff. His name is Mark Forstenhausler.

Mark indicated that he had "just came across a WWII German flag that was signed by Art Westerman from Woodstock, Illinois. I was told that the flag was signed by members of the 69th Infantry Division at the Leipzig-Thekla concentration camp in Germany. The camp was liberated on April 19, 1945. The flag is dated 20/4/45. Is Mr. Westerman still active in your Post? Was he in the 69th Division at Leipzig-Thekla? Any information that you can provide would be greatly appreciated."

Ok, so what was I to do with this? Who was Art? How did this guy Mark come across his name? Was Art even in our Post? A quick query of the newsletter database showed no Art Westerman. I didn't have him in the deceased list I keep from the newsletter addresses either. The local phone book didn't list any Westerman's.

I wrote back to Mark indicating what I had found. I got another letter back saying, "I emailed you because I found on vour website a Charter Member named Arthur E. Westerman. [ah, I forgot to look there! I forgot that I have all the Charter Members listed on the 5040 website!] The flag has the name 'Art Westerman, Woodstock, ILL' [sic] and it is dated 20/4/45. Since your Post was started on March 4, 1946 in Woodstock, Illinois with Mr. Westerman as a Charter Member, I would think that he is the same man who wrote on the flag."

"This flag was supposed to have flown over the concentration camp at Leipzig-Thekla, (a sub camp of Buchenwald) and I found out that the camp was liberated by the 69th Infantry Division on 19/4/45. I would like to confirm that Mr. Westerman

out anything else that I can." I sadly informed Mark that Art was a

deceased member of our Post. I'm not even sure when he passed away. I told Mark I would help out if I could and asked him to send some pictures of what he had.

I received in a follow up email the above photo and photos of a few signatures of the men that signed the flag.

Mark mentioned that "the circle is a very soft cloth that measures about 26 1/2" by 27 1/2". The edges were folded under and sewn on a very large red flag. The swastika was printed onto the white cloth. From what I have read and heard, it was popular with our GI's to write their names and home towns on captured flags as souvenirs. Folded up, the flags were easy to carry, and then they had something to remember the guys that they served with. Also it gave them the option to look up their friends after they came home from the war."

If the picture above comes out well in the printing process, you might be able to see some of the names on the flag. Mark was kind enough to also send me a list of the signatures and comments he could visually identify on the flag. The list includes the following, verbatim:

So, the question goes out to our VFW Post 5040 membership. Did anvone know Art Westerman from our Post? Does anyone have any information about him, where he served, what he did in the war. etc. to confirm if this is the same Art Westerman on the above flag? Anyone know if he has family in the area or how I might contact them to confirm some of the questions Mark is asking?

### Woodstock opens new High School to community By Don Peasley,

Dedication of Woodstock North High School (WNHS) campus on 80 acres on Raffle Road provides a fitting climax of expansion of educational facilities in the Woodstock area that began in the late 1980s. The October 18 ceremony and open house attracted a large turnout.

WNHS opened September 4 with 500 students, all freshmen and sophomores. The new building complex provides facilities for 1,600 students. Opening this school reduced crowding at Woodstock High School on South Street, which has 1,500 students this semester.

An important aspect of this ambitious expansion program is that the D200 board and staff planned, constructed and opened Prairiewood Elementary, Creekside Middle School and WNHS within the budget and in the timeframe announced following approval of the referendum. Voters approved the \$105 million referendum March 21, 2006

Construction of the Prairiewood and Creekside took place on property between Dean Street Road and Illinois Route 47. A developer began building houses in this area as the two respective schools rose on the eastern side of the area.

WNHS centers around open court yards and a commons with three primary wings—academic, P.E./athletics and fine and performing arts. There are many notable features but two that caught my eye are the spacious learning center (with the library) and the spacious indoor swimming pool. Let's not overlook the large indoor basketball arena, big enough for three full size basketball courts! When there is a varsity basketball game, bleachers are moved onto the adjoining basketball courts and it's time to "Play Ball."

WNHS is located in an attractive environment with landscaped courtyards and a pond on the property. Green features were part of the construction philosophy. A spread-out plan provides natural light for all classrooms. A "green roof" with stone paths and native vegetation extends the science program.

Brian McAdow, school principal, assumed leadership in developing this new high school. He has provided enthusiasm and energy. Before plans were finalized he talked with others who had built high schools in recent years and incorporated advice and suggestions based on this research.

WNHS has adopted school colors black, silver and teal and a school mascot Thunder. Those colors and mascot were chosen in the spring of 2008 by a vote of students who were to be the first to enroll at WNHS.

It's of interest to note that a significant part of the faculty and staff at WNHS are teachers who were located at WHS and chose to become a part of this new educational center in Woodstock.
