Patriotic bench displayed at VFW on Memorial Day

For those of you that stopped by VFW Post 5040 before or after Memorial Day, did you happen to notice something colorful out front? It was a painted bench with patriotic scenes, fitting for Memorial Day. After the parade, I just happened to meet the man responsible for bringing out the bench for public viewing.

Woodstock High School Art teacher, Herb Kruse, told me that the bench was part of a project that was funded by a District 200 Education Grant. Six benches were artistically decorated with a theme by various clubs at the school. This bench, the Art Club bench, was donated as a prize for District 200 supporters at a fund raising event.

The bench that was out in front of the VFW, along with the other five, was built by former Woodstock High School building trades student, Chris Lilja. About 30 hours of drawing and painting of the bench was completed by student artists Maggie Eigenfeld, Kassie Kamin, Arielle Penza, Brianna Pirro, Austin Emery, Skylar Stout, Samuel Sotelo, Samantha A. Murphy, Brittany Simpson, Janette Gonzalez, Stephany Rico, and Savannah Steiner.

Herb is a Woodstock resident and has been teaching for 22 years, the last five of which have been at Woodstock High School. When asked what the inspiration was for the patriotic themed bench, he said proudly, "My Father, Herb Kruse."

Kruse's father was a WWII veteran who died three years ago. A BM2 (Boatswain's Mate Petty Officer Second Class) in the United States Navy, Herb said that "many of his [Dad's] favorite memories were Navy memories."

"I believe our nation's children are disconnected from war and wars of the past.






