Post 5040 World War II veterans remember 65th anniversary of war's end

Robert Schroeder, World War II veteran of the war in the Pacific theater, led Woodstock's tribute to World War II veterans Saturday, August 14 as he played "Taps." The ceremony marked the 65th anniversary of the end of World War II with the 7 p.m. observance as Schroeder recalled how "Taps" became a musical tribute to those who have died in the service in the United States.

More than a dozen World War II veterans were surrounded by family members as Schroeder led Woodstock's portion of the national tribute to those who served in World War II. The 7 p.m. time was chosen to mark the 65th anniversary in time zones across the country.


After the ceremony VFW members moved to the VFW lounge holding a farewell for PFC Carol Ann Robinson. Carol Ann left Sunday, August 15 for training at Fort Sill, Oklahoma as an Army Transportation Operator Specialist in army tanks. Annual Soup To Nuts Sale October 1st and 2nd






This is your last reminder for the Soup to Nuts Sale, assuming that the newsletter arrives in your mailbox before the above mentioned dates.

2010-2011 Theme "Does Patriotism Still Matter?"

Entry Deadline November 1, 2010

Patriot's Pen, a youth-essay writing contest endorsed by the National Association of Secondary School Principals' contest criteria, is a nationwide competition that gives students in grades 6, 7 and 8 the opportunity to write essays expressing their views on democracy. Annually, more than 115,000 students participate in the annual contest.

Contestants write a 300-400 word essay based on an annual patriotic theme. The first-place winner receives a \$10,000 savings bond and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington D.C. The top national winners each receive a savings bond anywhere from \$1,000 to \$10,000.

Entry Deadline November 1, 2010

The Voice of Democracy, endorsed by the National Association of Secondary School Principals' contest criteria, is an audio essay contest for high school students in grades 9-12. The annual contest, which is designed to foster patriotism, allows students the opportunity to voice their opinion in a three to five minute essay based on an annual theme.

Created in 1947, the scholarship program annually provides more than \$3 million in scholarships. Each Department's first-place winner receives an all-expensepaid trip to Washington, D.C., plus the opportunity to compete for national scholarships. The first-place national winner receives a \$30,000 scholarship.

Schroeder's recollections of how "Taps" evolved is a heart-breaking story. In 1862 during the Civil War a Union Army captain found a dying soldier in the battlefield. It turned out the dying man was a Confederate soldier, and the captain risked his life to rescue the man from the battlefield. He then discovered the Confederate soldier was his own son. He was allowed to have only one musician for the funeral, and the haunting melody we now know as "Taps" was the music.

Tractors honor veterans at McHenry County Fair

Again this year visitors to the McHenry County Fair paused to honor county veterans who have died in our Armed Forces since the start of World War II and reflect with prayers for those now serving in hostile environments around the world.

The Woodstock VFW Rifle Squad commanded by Ron Nehls fired a three-volley salute after bugler Bob Schroeder sounded Taps.

Coupling the tribute with something that reflects McHenry County's rural background—antique tractors—the tribute August 5 included a parade of 21 tractors with the naming of the 211 men and women who have died in our wars since December 7, 1941.

Tim Shanks, event chairman, explained, "The tractors represent those men and women who died in wars. This event has become a great way to honor all veterans." The number of 21 tractors relates to the traditional 21-gun salute at dedications.

Rich Tobiasz, fair board member from Burton township, read the names of the men and women identified by their hometown as antique tractors methodically moved across the area in front of the grandstand.

A check of the list of those who have died from December 7, 1941 to the day of the fair includes the following: Crystal Lake, Cary and Fox River Grove, 47; Woodstock, 32; Harvard, 31; Algonquin and Huntley, 8; Marengo and Union, 19; Richmond and Hebron, 14; and Spring Grove, McHenry and Wonder Lake, 33. Most recent deaths were identified by the war: Korean War 16 (three from Woodstock); Vietnam War 33 (four from Wood-

stock); and War on Terror, 6.

The oldest tractors in the parade were two 1937 models - Alllis Chalmers driven by Dennis Alten and John Deere driven by Warren Glawe. The third tractor in the parade was an F-14 Farmall, 1938 model driven by Harry Alten.

Thanks to John and Ann Hansen for hosting the VFW 5040 picnic this year. Thank you for the use of the pool and providing the outstanding food. We look forward to next year, John. It was a great way to close out the summer!

Bud Porter honored at Post 5040

Like many volunteers at Woodstock VFW Post 5040, Bud Porter works on behalf of the Post without payment for time and services. Porter, Vietnam War veteran, was honored by the members on September 11 to recognize his many contributions to the Post.

The 5040 Club was organized by Porter. It is a private organization not controlled by the Post with the single purpose of caring for the building. Twenty-five members donate a minimum of \$100 a year. This year the club installed a fire door in the upstairs office; a trap door in the roof enabling people to get up to the roof without a ladder; and furnished paint for the outside of the building.

Porter has contributed tremendously financially to the Post. He donated the seed money and raised the rest of the money for the two television sets in the Post bar.

Porter and his brother Tim paid \$5,000 for the upstairs wheelchair ramp and \$2,500 for the downstairs ramp. He installed rails on both

Tim Porter, Woodstock, is not a veteran but continues to contribute to the Post.

When the Post Home needed two new furnaces. Porter raised the money by "drumming it up from the membership." He was instrumental in finding a man to paint the outside of the building for less than half of other bids. Porter found a renter for the office upstairs at the Post. It had been vacant for two years.

Elected to the board of directors in 2007, Porter served three years as president. Through the years, Porter has been involved in Veteran's Day and Memorial Day activities.

Porter served three tours in Vietnam, earning two Air Medals, two Bronze Stars and a Purple Heart.

Porter and his wife, Peggy Sue, will celebrate their 30th wedding anniversary in 2011. They reside in Woodstock.




